December 22, 2019 Fourth Sunday of Advent Mt 1:18-24

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

The Annunciation! Normally, with that word, we immediately think of

the angel Gabriel's visit to Mary announcing the work of the Holy Spirit within her to conceive the Savior Child. The Holy Spirit plants the Word of God within her. Found in Luke 1:31, Gabriel proclaims, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him <u>Jesus</u>." That was spoken to Mary, but what about **Joseph**? Did Joseph experience an Annunciation? Yes. And we hear about it in today's gospel of Matthew 1:20-21, where an angel in a dream announces to him "take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him <u>Jesus</u>, because he will save his people from their sins." It is all in the name. The divine origin of this child is revealed in the Name given! Jesus means 'God Saves'. God Saves- the plan is God's. It is God who directs our salvation if we cooperate. When we assent to God's will, great things happen! God saves us by joining us, bringing us into His plan. God saves us by involving us. We say 'Yes' and move along with God trusting His program. And God's good happens. However, we humans do not always cooperate with God. Adam and Eve took over the plan from God when they reached beyond God's design, grasping out at the fruit of the tree of knowledge. And what did that get them? Their 'way' brought them alienation: from life, from God and from themselves (the sin-fruits of death, loneliness and rivalry). So, human plans without God are doomed to fail, frustrate and fall on their face every time. We see this even in Joseph's great idea to 'save himself' in today's gospel. As a (self?) 'righteous man' (Mat 1:13), maybe it is pride that leads him to turn against Mary and the problem surprise of her sudden pregnancy without his contribution. He decides to 'dismiss her quietly' which was a compassionate gesture, but it was still a refusal of God's plan. He wanted to save himself from the humiliation of marrying a woman carrying someone else's child, and to save her the public shame and possible penalty of death that such offenses carried. But, God saves through God's own plan! As kind or well-intentioned as Joseph's idea was, it was not God's idea! Joseph was selling God short. In Isaiah 55:9 God says, "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts." Joseph may be on to something, but it will not bear the most fruit because it is not the Plan of God. Again, the child's name is "Jesus"-God Saves (not Joseph Saves). So Joseph

humbly realizes this and discovers that true 'righteousness' amounts to total trust

Yet, what about that other name mentioned in the prophecy of Isaiah 7:14, that the Savior would be born of a Virgin, and be called 'Emmanuel', meaning 'God is with us' (Matt 1:23)? Someone may ask, "Wait, that's two names: the name 'Jesus' AND the name 'Emmanuel'". Yes, but Emmanuel means 'God with us', so 1) God saves us by 2) being with us. The 'Emmanuel' part just adds the method of God's salvation (the how of it!). I'd say, "It's about God joining us. Put the two together, Jesus + Emmanuel, means God saves us by entering into our lives, right alongside us in our histories. The first name is the personal name, and the second name lays out HOW God goes about saving us. God saves us by coming alongside us and walking with us. He doesn't shout down commands from the sky. No, He comes down, finding us where we are and embraces our 'walk', speaking with us and leading us onward with Him. God intended such intimate familiarity between Himself and humans from the beginning, as Genesis 3:8 mentions a daily custom of God walking 'with Adam & Eve' until their selfish grasping at divine fruit led them to pull away from Him (ultimately even sending them out of Eden's garden). Over the years since Adam's expulsion from the garden there were other 'sanctified ones' who maintained a faithful walk with the Divine, keeping to God's plan, such as Enoch, who is mentioned in Genesis 5:24 as 'walking with God'. Yet, ultimately it took God 'coming down' to us and' walking beside us' to lead us back to full communion with Him. God had to enter into 'our walk' to show us the way back to the garden. We hear this exactly in Luke 24:15, when after Jesus' resurrection He joined His followers on the road, "while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them". It took God coming to us, in order for us to be led back to 'communion' with Him. We have to cooperate, and add our 'yes' to His plan, but God will lead and bring us to salvation. Jesus, as our Good Shepherd in John 10:4, He leads and walks with us, but we have to 'recognize His voice' and respond by accepting His direction. And Joseph comes to this acceptance by the help of the angel and dream of God's direction in today's gospel reading. We should too, because the Lord has come to us, walking with us and inviting us to carry His 'presence' in our lives. It's how Peace is 'borne'!
