

6. New carpet material has been chosen for all the common areas (the blue design previously shown us will be replaced with a tanish-gray design with a light blue line running through it, to match the blue walls.
7. "We're more than half-way done", said Michael. "The deadline to have everyone back in their own cottages and apartments is July 1".

Old Business

1. Cottages 10 and 11: Both have been repaired and will be back on the market soon.
2. Clearing of mud and debris from the catchments. The same company that will be clearing the area above our property will be clearing the entire property.
3. Roof leaks: That project will be done at the same time Sherman-Williams paints the exterior of our buildings.
4. Laundry Rooms: The laundry rooms on the first and second floor of the West wing are still not back in operation. Michael said it shall happen as soon as possible.
5. Opening of Makai offices: Michael said hopefully by July 15.
6. Shopping carts: Joann has purchased three new ones (and Bobbie contributed one), so there should be no shortage now AS LONG AS RESIDENTS SIGN OUT FOR ONE AND RETURNS IT THAT DAY.
7. Name plaques on buses: Joann reported they have not yet been installed
8. Photos and Ids above mail boxes: To be done later.
9. Bulletin Boards: The locked bulletin board by the mail boxes is not large enough and not always current. Notices are still appearing stuck on the elevator mirrors and on the adjacent columns – looking very tacky. Two suggestions were made: (a) Place the table currently in the middle of the dining room in the BDR near the DR entrance and place notices on it, for more residents to see them. (b) place a long table against the windows opposite the top of the grand staircase, and place notices and announcements on it. This would hopefully be seen by most every resident (more than in the elevators, not used by everyone).
10. Broken chairs: They are once again accumulating in the DR and BDR.
11. DR Snack Bar: Because some residents are taking more than one item, the fridge is depleted almost the same day it is stocked. The budget for that amenity cannot handle the demand, SO UNLESS RESIDENTS STOP "BREAKING THE RULES", THERE WILL BE NO MORE SNACK BAR. Michael pointed out that this problem does NOT exist in Assisted Living or in Mauka. Please report to Management anyone you see taking more than one item. We love the Snack Bar idea.

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
