This Day in History

02/20/20

On this day in history, in 1998, Tara Lipinski won the gold medal in figure skating at the Olympic Winter Games. The 15-year-old was the youngest gold medalist in her sport. In 2006, Lipinski was inducted into the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame.

02/21/20

On this day in history, in 1885, The Washington Monument was formally dedicated to honor the first president of the United States. The monument was started in 1848, but the American Civil War interrupted construction and Congress finally funded the project in 1876. Three years after dedication, the monument was opened to the public.
