




So where is Colonial Hills anyway?

Location: Southwest Pasco County.

Inside of the Elfers District





Snuggled East of US 19 - South of SR54 And West of Madison Street. With the main Intersection of Grand Blvd. and Moog Road located in the middle.

*SR 54 widens - Saturn Drive never opened. Creates bottleneck traffic, Flooding, and lack of an evacuation route in case of an Emergency.





*High Traffic business moves onto 19/54 NPR Hyundai/Sun Toyota/Nissan Creates Cut Through traffic -Loud Intercom - Paint fumes.





*House of Beauty takes over Community Sign.
Community pushed aside slowly.






*Constant Problem Houses - Star One Foreclosure.









No Street Lights on Manor Drive, Moog Road (From Colonial Hills Drive to US 19), or the first 4 streets of Colonial Manor. Overgrown (Mature) Trees block light on Beacon Hill Drive.



Some Alarming Statistics:

From January 2014 - March 2015 224 code violations reported.

From February 27, 2015-March 28, 2015

275 calls to the Sheriff's Office.

Walkable community - sidewalks


We have property (WalMart owned) next to us. possible: Affordable housing complex or Intermodal Center. SR 54.








Team Black: Code and Crime Tour
