

We are instructed to notify the sheriff's office with what we see and hear and report the time and the location. We do not engage with any criminal activity we just inform the sheriff's office.

In order to perform our mission, we need to maintain the vehicle and its cost, so, here is where you come in to help us help you. We have to ask for donations at your local restaurants and businesses that you may frequent. When you see the Crime Watch donation container please drop whatever you can in that container and that will help us buy the fuel for the vehicle and the maintenance that it needs on occasion. Also, we have a luncheon every month that rotates between all of the restaurants in Hernando Beach.

For each plate served the restaurant donates \$2, the lunch menu usually runs around \$10 plus drink. Hernando County citizens with trash service also have weekly curbside recycling collection included in their service. Curbside recycling is collected with a two bin system where residents sort cardboard and paper in one bin and plastics #1-7, aluminum and tin in a second bin. Please note that our curbside program does not include glass. These bins are then picked up by our contractor and delivered to the Northwest Waste Management Facility. The material is then further sorted and prepared for shipment to various locations by a contractor.

If you currently subscribe to curbside trash service through Republic Services, once per week curbside Recycling is included in your service **at no additional cost.**

To get started with curbside recycling please call • Republic Services at (352) 540-6457 to have your *free*bins delivered and determine your recycling pickup day.

On your pickup day, place all of your paper and cardboard in one container and aluminum, tin, and plastics in the second container. Place the containers curbside before 6 a.m. on your service day.

Curbside recycling is a great opportunity to help yourself, your community and the environment.

- Customers shall set out yard waste within six feet or as near to the roadway abutting the customer's property as safely possible
- Although every effort is made to keep areas clean of spilled yard waste, some spillage may occur when transferring loose yard waste from the container to the truck

Alternative Disposal Options

- Hernando County Residents may take their own yard waste to one of our three locations for disposal
- Residents may dispose of a combined total of up to 2,000 lbs of all types of solid waste per year for free
- It is a violation of Hernando County Ordinance to dump yard waste or other waste on any vacant property, private property or public rights of way
- Commercial businesses are required to take waste to the Northwest Landfill and be charged the appropriate tipping fee for disposal
