### Update on the 50th Anniversary Capital Campaign

The Schuyler County Historical Society's 50th Anniversary Capital Campaign is in full swing after its public kick-off on September 16.

Under the leadership of campaign Chair Jean Hubsch and Co-chair Beverly Stamp, the campaign has currently raised \$79,000- over half the goal of \$150,000.

The capital campaign was undertaken to raise funds for urgently needed repairs at the Society's museums. The Brick

Tavern Museum's antiquated heating system and exterior appearance are tops on the refurbishment list.

To "get the word out" about the campaign, Jean Hubsch and Museum Executive Director Andrew Tompkins have been making the rounds to local organizations such as the Rotary and Lions Club.

Speaking in front of their members about the importance of the Society to the county is an important aspect of obtaining support for the campaign. It also makes Schuyler County residents more aware of the great cultural resource they have in their backyards.
