

Historic Depot & Lighthouse Museums Extend Hours Next Weekend

The Lake County Historical Society's Depot and Lighthouse Museums will be open extended hours, 10 AM to 6 PM August 4th through 7th during the Two Harbors Festival of Sail. The 3M Birthplace Museum will be open all day 11 AM to 4 PM. Educational programming has been organized by the LCHS programs committee at the lighthouse grounds. Programming partners throughout the weekend include Canadian National, Wolf Ridge Environmental Learning Center, and the Midwest Peregrine Society. General admission is \$15 for each day, free for LCHS members at the door.

General admission will provide admission to the 3 historic museums operated by the Lake County Historical Society: The Depot, Lighthouse, and 3M Birthplace Museums. This includes access to programming booths on the Two Harbors lighthouse grounds. 10% of all ticket sales will go to the Society's Keep the Light Lit Campaign to raise funds for a modern rotating beacon which will restore the iconic sweep and signature of the light to the North Shore.

The Society has also organized Tour and Tea of the B&B, An hour-long program which brings to life the history of the lighthouse through the first head keeper family, the Lederles. Small groups of 8 will enjoy strawberry angel food cake in the dining room and learn more about the rich history of the lighthouse on Agate Bay. Why strawberries? Keeper Lederle was known for growing some

of the largest strawberries in the garden at lighthouse point.

Keeper Charles, his wife Margaretha, son John, and daughters Rose and Theresa moved to the newly constructed lighthouse in 1891. Debuting on the opening of the 1892 season, the Two Harbors lighthouse has been operating for 130 years. The Lederle family resided in the lighthouse for nearly twenty years, witnessing first hand the drastic changes from small village of 1,000 to an organized town of 6,500. Tickets for the special program are \$50 per person and \$45 per member with all proceeds going to Keep the Light Lit.

About LCHS

The Lake County Historical Society was established in 1925 to "collect, preserve and disseminate information about Lake County." Operating 3 historic sites, the Society brings to life the rich history of the County through exhibits and programming.

About the Keep the Light Lit Campaign

July 11th, 2020 LCHS belayed large parts of the old DCB 224 beacon down the side of the lighthouse tower July 11th, 2020 to make room for the loaned beacon. In the late 1990s, Joe Zastera was a driving force in securing the DCB 224 beacon to restore the original sweep of the lens. The beacon dated to 1969 and was repurposed from another lighthouse prior to installation at the Two Harbors Lighthouse. Refurbished with help from the community, a boom truck from Aspen Equipment lifted parts of the beacon to the crow's nest, nearly 50 feet off the ground. From there, volunteer keepers Leon Jacobson, Tom Koehler, Todd Ronning, and Brad Ronning along with members of the coast guard re-assembled the beacon inside of the lighthouse tower. For the past 21 years, the volunteer keepers have been maintaining, repairing, and keeping the beacon lit. On November 25th, 2019 the beacon had a failure that could not be repaired. Ever since the beacon went dark the Lake County Historical Society (LCHS) has been working to re-light the beacon at the iconic Two Harbors lighthouse located on a rocky point between
