



The enthusiasm for Rotary didn't take long to manifest itself and for us to make a mark both here and throughout the Rotary community. Our speakers ranged from Jim McMann, Superintendent of the State Police, to celebrities like Dan Pellitier from the Texas Rangers and, of course, local politicians and community leaders as well as other Rotarians sharing the many Rotary programs and activities throughout the District.

While we encouraged participation in District programs and events, we were a very active club with our own programs. We committed to the youth and seniors in our area and because we were new with a limited Treasury most of that commitment was through active participation rather than cash donations. Some of these activities included a Golf Tournament for Jim Fitz's SAFE (Sports Are For Everyone) and Dr. Craig's program for "SIDS." A number of the members gave up a Saturday and worked at a children's camp in West Sand Lake, cleaning the grounds, painting the cabins, fixing the docks etc. We supported Cindy Schmehl's efforts in Zimbabwe, donated to "Chamber Angels," volunteered at the Senior Center, held raffles to benefit youth activities and on and on. was honored to be the president of the club during the centennial anniversary of Rotary, 2004 -2005. The theme was "Celebrate Rotary." Several members of the Chapter attended the Centennial Convention in Chicago, where Chapters were encouraged to identify a special centennial project that would result in a lasting memorial for our community. Twin Bridges raised money to install a flagpole and memorial stone in the park at the corner of Moe and Clifton Park Center Roads.

That year also marked the Chapter's sponsorship of a mission trip to Chikandakubi Village in Zimbabwe with the Rotary Chapter of Victoria Falls. During 2004 the Chapter embarked on a long-term commitment to a school in Africa for 300 children: modernizing



books, supplies, curriculum, equipment, and the building using a Foundation matching grant. The project, which included hands-on site work, has expanded to include issues including health, clothes, food and water. This project was chosen for First Place Recognition for District 7190 in the Zone Institute Centennial Honors Program. On a personal note, one of our members, Barbara Hofmann lost her battle with leukemia; her friendship and service to the Chapter were memorialized with the planting of a Rose of Sharon in the park where the flagpole was dedicated.


ccomplishments included numerous donations:
