

#### MINUTES FOR JANUARY AND FEBRUARY 2012

MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 4, 2012

The GSSN met on Wednesday, January 4, 2012, at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV. President Ian Thaler called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM and led in pledging allegiance to the flag. Everyone was asked to silence their cell phones and all were welcomed to the meeting--there were 13 visitors and 71 signed in. Dara gave the Treasurer's Report; and then Fred made a motion to accept the report as read. Rick Young seconded the motion and it was passed. Next Ian asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the October 5<sup>th</sup> and November 2<sup>nd</sup> meetings as published in the HighGrader. Fred made such a motion and Morris seconded. Vote was unanimously in favor & it too passed. The next agenda item was the January outing which will be a 2-day outing (Jan. 21-22) at claim #28 -- lunch on Sat. will be pot luck and on Sun. breakfast and lunch will be provided by the club. Camping was encouraged and a sign-up sheet was provided. Next, the purchase of a puffer-type drywasher was discussed. which will be further researched.

The Feb. 1, 2012 meeting will feature a Show & Tell. Everyone is invited to bring in equipment and dry washers will be discussed at that time. Next Fred (chair of the audit committee) reported that the Audit Committee met at his house on Dec. 14<sup>th</sup> and everything balanced to the penny. The treasurer, Dara, was thanked for a job well done. (She also did a great job organizing the GSSN Christmas Party Dec. 7, 2011, and was congratulated for that as well.) The annual Gold Show was discussed next and a committee will be formed this year relative to streamlining our planning and participation. There being no further new business, a short break was taken after which Bill Durban, Chief of Southern NV Operations - Abandoned Mine Lands / Mineral Education Programs spoke on "Stay Out and Stay Alive" and the group enjoyed his interesting and informative slide presentation followed by a Q & A. The raffles were held next and the results follow below. The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.

#### MEETING MINUTES FEBRUARY 1, 2012

The GSSN met at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV on Wednesday, Feb. 1, 2012. President Ian Thaler called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM and led in pledging allegiance to the flag. He welcomed all (96 signed in and there were 13 visitors). Dara gave the Treasurer's Report. Fred then made a motion to accept the report as read; Morris seconded; and the motion carried. Ian asked who came to the last outing and if anyone found gold. Many hands were raised. The next outing will be Feb. 25 & 26 in Pahrump at the Johnnie claim. A sign-up sheet as well as some directions were provided. Volunteers were asked to help out with outings and a reminder was made to bring a pick, water, chairs. Ian asked those interested in helping out to contact him and thanked those who have helped out at past outings. He also asked for volunteers to help out with the HighGrader and also requested those interested in doing so to contact him.

Under New Business Ian said that Rick of Desert Outfitters is in the planning stage of organizing a class in geology -- anyone interested should contact Rick. Alan Shook then announced that if anyone is interested in square dancing to contact him for more information. Next Dennis Johnson spoke about a mining museum / recreational facility which is in the process of being put together in Dolan Springs by 80-yr-old Bob Taylor; more information will be provided as it becomes available. DeAnna Costen, president of the Las Vegas chapter of the GPAA spoke briefly about Quartzite AZ. She has info on claims there; anyone interested should contact her. Ron Huff expressed concerns about non-members being on GSSN claims and specifically about asking people for ID in order to prevent unauthorized people from prospecting and removing material who shouldn't being doing so. He made a motion that a committee be formed to deal with these concerns and Dave Simpson seconded the motion. DeAnna agreed to chair the committee, and several volunteered to serve on it (including Dennis and George N). After some discussion, a motion was made by Rick Young to table the motion to form this committee and Dennis J. seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion was tabled.

After a short break, Ian brought up Old Business -- specifically the purchase of a puffer by the club. He mentioned a few options. Then Alan Shook made a motion (which was seconded by Richard Harding) to buy a Keene DW 212 from Desert Outfitters for \$500. After a brief discussion, the vote was unanimous and the motion carried. \$340 from a December 2011 fund raiser will be used and \$160 will be added to that amount to complete the purchase. A 12v. DC Battery will be the responsibility of whomever uses the puffer. There being no further Old Business, the "show & tell" of equipment took place for half an hour.

### **Our First Picker**

We set up Saturday morning at "34" (the November outing). Dan, June, and I were here to run our wet wash sluice to see if we could find Gold. All we needed was a little color to make us happy. What we got was a little more than we expected.

The first bucket we ran was from the bottom of the wash below the camping area. There was only one little speck in the cleanup. We moved up out of the bottom only to find one more speck. The 3rd and 4<sup>th</sup> buckets yielded less than that.

We decided to visit with the others at the outing, hoping to find out the "Golden Secret". We talked with members from our club and some from the Mohave club. Some had metal detectors, dry washers, shovel and buckets (taking their material home because it was too wet to dry wash), and one couple had a cup of coffee for me (things were looking up). We talked about where the "Gold" was and how to get it. Everyone was so helpful. With a large sweep of their hand they told us that "The Gold is out there". When Willie Biron got there he said to look for the "Red Dirt".

After hearing the stories of the latest find - The 6 ounce Nugget- we headed "**Out There**" looking for the "**Red Dirt**". We moved to the head of the wash where a few of the others were working. Finding bedrock/caliche in the bottom and up the sides of the wash, we recovered a bucket from the first 8 inches above the caliche. We swept the caliche clean of all material and headed back to our set-up area.

It was getting late and the sun was going down fast. Working fast we ran the material through the sluice and did a quick clean-up. Panning the concentrated material in the dark and cold isn't fun. Not until you see the large piece in the pan when you're not even sure it was even **Gold**. After screaming for someone to find my glasses and a flashlight, I showed my wife and son our "**Picker**". All of the others who had been standing around to see if we found anything seemed to have left for home. Even Dan Boone who was camping there that night could not be found.

We packed up and headed for home not wanting to loose any gold in the dark. The first thing we did at home was to finish panning in the light of our kitchen. There was enough color in the pan to make us happy, but there was our "**Picker**". This was our first piece of gold we could pick up with our fingers. It probably weighs less than a pennyweight, but it was the "**Mother Load**" to us.
