Jim Reuschlein gave a Management/Financial report. Some of the highlights are: the average sale of our condos is \$130,000. Jeffrey (asphalt company) will be repairing Heritage Road at their cost. Our Reserve is steadily growing.

Bill Charles gave his final remarks. He thanked us for the pleasure of serving on the Board for the past 6 years. He suggested the Reserve Fund should be \$1,000,000. Finally he noted that the higher-grade roof shingles now being used was the better choice.

Susie Brock asked that members get involved in events. Members will get to know each other and member involvement can save us money. Susie presented Bill with a token of our appreciation.

The candidates for the Board were introduced.

Ballots were collected and counted.

- Donna T. and Linda B. will check into arranging a holiday dinner or lunch for Colonial Acres at Aubrees. Further details as they become available.
- Possible dinner at the South Lyon Hotel being investigated by Linda B. Ordering will be off the menu as the Buckboard concept has been discontinued.
- The committee discussed the newsletter and the directory vs. the budget. Also, the content balance of the newsletter related to text/information and amount of advertising.





The National Fire Protection Association continues to be the international sponsor of the week.

Since 1922, **Fire Prevention Week** (FPW) has been observed on the Sunday through Saturday period in which October 9 falls to commemorate the Great Chicago **Fire** of 1871. This fire killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land. It is used as a time to educate people about fire safety awareness & help ensure your home & family is protected. This year Fire Prevention Week starts on: **October 03 thru October 9, 2021.**

- Three of every five fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no working smoke alarm, check those batteries!
- ✓ Less than 50% of homeowners have an escape plan
- ✓ Carbon monoxide is the #1 cause of accidental poisoning in the US
- ✓ 60% of consumers do not test their smoke & CO alarms
- ✓ Only 47% of people report having a CO alarm in their homes
- ✓ Unattended cooking is the #1 cause of home fires!

We at Colonial Acres not only need to protect our unit against fires but the whole building we live in. Let's be good neighbors and make sure we have working fire & carbon monoxide alarms. **STAY SAFE**!


