Plant a tree. Honor the first day of spring, and Earth Day shortly thereafter, by planting trees. Trees provide habitats for wildlife, create shade, reduce air pollution by filtering the air, and produce oxygen. A sapling is a mangeable tree to plant and something children can do as well.


Enjoy trying some spring crafts. Grab an inexpensive canvas and paint a landscape that is in full bloom. Use quick-set plaster to create stepping stones embedded with mosaic glass pieces for color that can be added to the backyard.

Creat an excuse for a get-together and host a spring potluck. Put fresh spring vegetables and fruits on display. Options include artichokes, apricots, asparagus, carrots, dandelion greens, and radishes. Put together a pasta primavera, which essentially is a spring pasta dish laden with fresh vegetables.

Decorate inside your home with flowers. Bring fresh flowers indoors and put them on display in vases or table centerpieces. Cut stems on a 45degree angle underwater to help flowers last longer. In addition, choose floral themed curtains and throw pillows to add some spring decor.

Create a water feature. The sound and sights of cascading water can be both relaxing and picturesque. A water feature can be something as simple as a small fountain or more elaborate like a koi pond.

## The Fishin' Hole

The annual trout stocking has started for the year 2023. The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission will be stocking 4.2 million trout this year. The commission started the process in the last week of February and it will continue throughout the year on approved trout waters. They expect nearly 80% (over 3.3 million) of those fish to be in the water before the statewide opening day of trout season on Saturday, April 1st. This year's fish include 2.3 million Rainbow Trout, over 700,000 Brown Trout, over 160,000 Brook Trout, and 14,000 Golden Palomino Trout. Yes, the countdown is most certainly on. Much of the stocking is still to be done here in the month of March; so as always, I recommend you go out and help do the work. The dates and times for each county are available on the Fish Commission web page at fishandboat.com. Simply enter your county and find your fishery. The stocking sites and times will then pop up for you.

Last month we talked about the psychology of fishing and being a better angler by believing the fish are there. Nothing gives you a stronger belief than actually putting the fish there yourself. Hopefully, your relationship to "knowing" you put the fish in your fishery will be better than my relationship to "knowing" I put my car keys on top of the microwave. It's much too often that I "know" I did that, but they are in my pocket. Trout Season begins April 1st at 8:00 a.m. There will be a "Mentored Youth Trout Day" on March 25, 2023. The following excerpt is from the Commission's website:

"Youth anglers need a Mentored Youth Permit OR a Voluntary Youth Fishing License from the Commission and to be accompanied by an licensed adult angler to participate. With their License OR

Permit, they can take a total of two trout (combined species) with a minimum length of 7 inches. Adult anglers are prohibited from possessing trout.

Anglers 16 years of age or older are adult anglers and need a valid Pennsylvania Fishing License and a current Trout/Salmon Permit. To participate on MYTD, anglers over 16 must be accompanied by an eligible holder of a Mentored Youth Fishing Permit OR a Voluntary Youth Fishing License from the Commission."

The price of your fishing license will be \$25.47 for the annual adult resident this year with an additional fee of \$12.47 for the trout stamp which you must have to fish in approved trout waters. The Lake Erie permit is an additional \$9.97 for the year. You can save a little money by purchasing a combination Trout and Lake Erie Permit for \$18.47 for the year.

All of those and many more options are available online with the added bonus of saving the document in your computer in case you would lose your license. Yes, it comes in very handy sometimes; see above with regard to "knowing" I put my keys on that darn microwave.

The incredible, warm late winter weather this year has allowed many folks to get out locally on our rivers and fish for much of this past February. Reports are that Walleye are biting night crawlers on the Allegheny near the locks. Also the Musky bite has been good all winter on the Youghiogheny.

It's time to get ready for Opening Day! Get your gear together, be safe, have fun, keep those lines tight and if you see my car keys anywhere shoot me an email please at samdhall@comcast.net.
