



HDHA Scholarship

Hawaii faces many oral health care challenges, particularly increase rate of early childhood caries (ECC) due to lack of water fluoridation and oral health disparities due to limited access to dental care in some rural areas. As advocates, we must initiate the change that is needed in order to address our public health needs. Allowing the ADHP access to population that is currently underserved will help increase access to care and abate and eliminate oral healthcare disparities in a cost-effective approach in our local community. But to accomplish this goal, we need have a unified voice and work collaboratively amongst each other and our supporters. Communication and involvement of both our dedicated leaders and committed followers are vital in the process of changing and advancing our profession.

As a soon to be newly graduate dental hygienist, I am looking forward to working with individuals from our organization in developing and enhancing my leadership and professional skills and the contributing to the much needed dental care and education to our communities and patients.


