Paul David Hewson is not a household name. Bono, Hewson's stage name, is perhaps more recognizable. Bono is the lead singer of the rock band known as U2.

One of the traits of U2's music has been its fresh and poignant expression of God's grace. Bono once noted that the concept of grace is what makes Christianity unlike any other religion. Grace has always been at the forefront of Bono's relationship with Christ evidenced by one very popular U2 song entitled "Grace." Here are some of the lyrics:

Grace, she takes the blame, she covers the shame, removes the stain, it could be her name. Grace, it's the name for a girl, it's also a thought that changed the world.

Grace, she carries a world on her hips, no champagne flute for her lips, no twirls or skips between her fingertips, she carries a pearl in perfect condition. What once was hurt, what once was friction, what left a mark, no longer stings, because Grace, because Grace makes beauty out of ugly things, Grace finds beauty in everything, Grace finds goodness in everything

Grace. God's loving kindness that we do not deserve or earn. Ephesians 2.6-10 tells us:

God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷ in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

God expressed grace through Jesus Christ and that grace is expressed through our acts of kindness, mercy, and love.

Grace is being expressed through the grace-filled response to the of nearly half the world's population that lacks easy access to safe, clean water. As we partner with Lifewater International and with the generous matching grant of up to \$12,000, we can herald God's love and grace and significantly change the lives

of several hundred people. \$24,000 will provide clean water wells, sanitary latrines, hygiene training, and the presentation of the gospel message to over 600 people living in villages in Ethiopia or Uganda.

Another expression of grace is the "Building Bridges with our Muslim Neighbors" mission trip to El Cajon planned for September 24th through October 6th. We will be equipped to build relationships with the hundreds of immigrants and refugees settling in El Cajon, to understand their cultures, and to convey the love of Jesus with our words and through acts of kindness.

Grace. It has removed the hurt, the friction (between humans and God), what left a mark (sin), no longer stings. Grace has removed the sting of death which is sin. By grace we are reconciled to God.

Thank you for the multitude of ways you – and we together as a congregation – convey the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

A New Arrow in God's Quiver

hese days, I am often in awe of how God works. What started out as a "simple" missions trip to a refugee camp in Greece has turned into a groundbreaking immersion/ training outreach to one of the largest communities of Muslims in the United States. Some of the most innovative and highly respected missionaries/ trainers will come together for a twoweek period from September 24th through October 6th.

Only now, as I have connected with the speakers and trainers, do I understand how amazing our "Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors" truly is. Those who will speak and train are truly enthusiastic about this new venture. Some have even been praying for such an opportunity as this to come out of an area church.

Another Arrow in God's Quiver

God has determined that His work on earth, to further His kingdom of love, grace, and mercy, is to be done by people who have declared that they will follow His Son, Jesus. It seems like it would be much more efficient and effective if He did it all Himself, but He wants us involved in what He does. As I have been working on "Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors," this truth brought to mind an analogy of archery.

I grew up in a household that was fascinated with medieval war and hunting implements. My personal favorite was the bow and arrow - I loved archery. I never was very accurate, but I loved the delicacy of how a bow works unlike the heavy spear or sword. A good archer could, with just a whisper of air, plant an arrow with absolute accuracy.

The image of God as the Master Archer came to mind. His outreach to the world are His arrows. We participate by being parts of those arrows through which He can pierce the darkness, bringing light and love to a lost world.

In the case of "Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors," Trinity Church is the shaft - the piece that gives the arrow structural integrity. The shaft provides balance and must be in perfect proportion to the bow. A good shaft needs to be strong, but also light enough to fly quickly and easily. Trinity Church has given that integrity, strength, and flexibility to support this new adventure.

The teachers and trainers for this mission trip are the fletching, the feathers at the end of the arrow. Fletching stabilizes the arrow, giving it the ability to fly straight and true. It works by causing the shaft to spin as it leaves the bow, similar to the spiral spin on a football as a guarterback passes it. Fletching preserves the speed and accuracy of the arrow. Without it, the arrow wobbles out of control. The teachers and trainers coming to bring their knowledge and understanding are of the highest caliber in the Christian world. Most of them have lived many years in predominately Muslim countries, serving God in difficult circumstances. Lastly, the participants in "Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors," create the arrowhead. An arrowhead is completely useless without the shaft and fletching, but together the arrowhead can pierce through with accuracy and power. Please pray that God will bring participants that are teachable, caring, open, and love God with their whole hearts.

It is with these three elements that God can use us to take down powers of darkness, not of flesh and blood, but of principalities. We can bring love, grace, mercy, and care to a group of people who, in many cases, are desperate for friendship and love. We will be a new arrow in God's quiver.


- \$6,000 serves a small village of about 150 people
