2019 CALENDARS



Share the beauty of your garden by submitting photos for the 2019 calendar. Deadline this year is June 30th. This lets us get the calendar printed in time for the fall annual meeting.

If possible try to take shots of multiple plants. While shots of single plants can be almost breathtaking, the object of the calendar is to share photos of our gardens. Al-

ways look at what is in the background when you frame your picture. Make sure it is not too busy and doesn't detract from the plants you want to feature.

Mail or take in your 4 x 6 glossies to the office with your name and phone number on the back. Address stickers work well. The photos must be of your own garden taken by you, an amateur photographer. Br. Mark Floreanini, St Vincent Associate Professor of Studio Arts will select the winning photos.

Since some colors don't translate well when scanned we are trying to have available digital copies of photos to submit for printing. Submit 4 x 6 glossy color photos just as you've always done. But this year identify the photos you submit so if one of your photos is chosen we can contact you and ask you to send in the digital copy of the chosen photo. Store your pictures on your phone or computer and name each one. When you print out the glossy write that name on the back of the photo along with your name and phone number using a ballpoint pen. Then it will be easy for the calendar committee to ask for the digital copy of "Calendar Photo#101, Rudbeckias#1, Back Garden#3, etc." (whatever name you have selected). Do not send in any digital copies unless requested. We'll tell you where to send them later. You must still submit 4 x 6 glossies.
