# HISTORY JESSON: A WELSH WILLIAM TELL

On 18th November 1307, William Tell shot an arrow through an apple on his son's head and launched the struggle for Swiss independence. However in Wales, there is a similar legend that pre-dates this famous tale by perhaps a hundred years.

#### What we know of Madog ap Gruffydd Maelor's Life

It is uncertain when exactly Madog ap Gruffydd Maelor was born, but in 1191, he succeeded his father as Prince of Powys jointly with his brother Owain and adopted a neutral position between Gwynedd and England.

Six years later, after his brother's death, he consolidated power and

became the sole ruler of Powys north of the Afon Rhaeadr and the Afon Tana. This area was named after him, Powys Fadog, a mutation on his name.

Madog's alliance with his cousin Llywelyn ap Iorwerth (Llywelyn the Great), deteriorated, and by 1212 he had allied himself with King John of England. The alliance with Llywelyn was re-established by 1215, however.

He died in 1236 and was succeeded by his oldest son Gruffydd Maelor II.

#### What we know of William de Braose's Life

William de Braose was a favourite of King John and at the peak of his power in Wales, was Lord of Gower, Abergavenny, Brecknock, Builth, Radnor, Kington and Glamorgan.

His wife Maud supported his military ambitions and put her in charge of Hay Castle and is often referred to as the Lady of Hay.

In 1175, William de Braose carried out the Abergavenny Massacre, luring three Welsh princes and other Welsh leaders to their deaths at a Christmas feast at Abergavenny Castle.

This resulted in great hostility against him among the Welsh, who named him the "Ogre of Abergavenny".

In 1198, Maud, his wife, defended Painscastle against a massive Welsh attack led by Gwenwynwyn, Prince of Powys Wenwynwen, until English

killed. In 1208, William de Braose quarrelled with King John, making indiscreet comments regarding the murder of the king's nephew Arthur of Brittany. The King seized all of de Braose's castles and William and Maud fled the country to Ireland.

De Braose returned to Wales in 1210, and it is speculated that he allied himself with Llywelyn ap Iorwerth, Madog ap Gruffydd Maelor's cousin, in his rebellion against King John. Maud and her son were apprehended and imprisoned at Corfe Castle in Dorset, where they both starved to death.

In 1211, William de Braose died in France after fleeing from Wales the previous year, disguised as a beggar.

#### The Legend

Sometime between 1191 and 1208 while the hostilities between the two princes of the region raged, Madog ap Gruffydd Maelor, Prince of Powys Fadog, who had been dispossessed of his lands in Breconshire by William de Braose, shot an apple from the head of his youngest son, also called Madog, on the orders of de Braose's wife Maud.

It details the hardships and adventures they faced, focusing primarily on the theme of

immigration. The play is written in a lyrical, poetic style and presented using minimal set and a physicalised performance style.

It is directed by Gareth John Bale, the Welsh actor and director whose credits include *Grav* and *Nye and Jennie* and Gwenllian Higginson, best known to Welsh theatre audiences for *Miss Julie*, *Exodus* and *Merched Caerdydd*.

'West' was commissioned by the North American Festival of Wales and received its first public performance in the Ballroom of the Hilton Hotel, Milwaukee, Wisconsin on Friday 30th August 2019. The first American performances received standing ovations from an enthusiastic American audience.
