# **BUILDINGS & GROUNDS**

I would like to thank the congregation for their financial support of the church building and grounds projects this past year. We started out 2020 with the renovation and modernization of the restrooms. We then moved on to purchasing new chairs for the sanctuary and modernization of the altar area and painting of the doors and trim throughout the building. As fall rolled around we experienced two major problems with our heating and air-conditioning systems.

The air conditioning system which cools the kitchen, restrooms, Nursery and hallway needs to be replaced by spring 2021. This will cost \$4,400. These funds were included in our 2021 Operating Budget.

As we started the heating system last fall it was discovered that there was water in our underground fuel tank which was causing problems with keeping the boiler for heat operating. To address this problem a new fuel tank was placed above ground. This was done in late November and the existing underground fuel oil tank was removed in December.

#### Status of Heating and Air Conditioning Problems:

- Heating air-conditioning in the office area was repaired on November 17, 2020 with funds from the operating budget.
- We have received proposals to replace the Air conditioning system for the kitchen and restroom areas. The lowest proposal that has been received is in the amount of \$4,400. This project was included in our 2021 0perating Budget. Work will be completed before spring 2021.
- The new above ground oil tank was installed on November 19, 2020. The installer filled the new above ground oil tank with oil, serviced the boiler, and started the boilers for the winter season.



• The old underground oil tank was removed on December 17th. The holes in the tank were small so there was no contaminated soil that had to be removed, which would have been additional expense.



The total cost for the new oil tank, serving the boiler and removal of the old tank is \$7,050.

If you can contribute to help cover the cost of the oil tank project, it would be greatly appreciated. Please mark your contribution as "Oil Tank project". To date we have received approximately \$3,000.

I would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year. We welcome 2021!
