
Hebrews 12:14-Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord.

The thanks of the lips may be polite; but it is the thanks of the heart that rings true and warms the heart of the one who receives it.

Moreover, gratitude is the test of character. Shakespeare tells us that the winter wind is not so unkind as man's ingratitude. The wind may chill the body, but ingratitude chills the soul.

Of course, there may be some who say, "I have nothing for which to be thankful." Such a one is poor indeed. These words flow only from a poverty-stricken heart-unhappy, bitter jealous, and covetous. did you ever notice that the poor are often more thankful than the rich? The reason is that the poor more frequently count their blessings. They have God's sun and air, health and life, and loved ones; the things that make life rich indeed. Our thankfulness is not measured by the amount of our possessions. The man with a thankless heart is poor, and the man with a thankful heart is rich.

When we are offered a gift, then snatch it out of the hand of the giver and say, "That's mine; it belongs to me anyway," there is no gratitude there. How often a child does that, and "a thankless child is sharper than a serpent's tooth." Yet, that is what countless thousands do to their Heavenly Father, counting every earthly blessing, plus all the beauty of this world, as theirs by their own right.

Once again, our nation is summoned to observe its national day of Thanksgiving. We do not thank a thing, nor a law of nature, nor luck; we thank a Person. We do not thank America; we thank God for America. Whether it was on the bleak New England shores of the Pilgrims, or in the dark days of the Civil War when Abraham Lincoln called our nation to give thanks, or today; how much there is to be thankful for to God. Yet, when our God looks down upon this nation which we want Him to bless, I wonder if He sees us snatching everything out of His hand, boasting of our own sufficiency, or does He see us in His courts giving thanks? How much do we warm His heart? How much can we expect His mercy and blessing?

A gift is not to be worked for, nor paid for, but received. So it is with God's unspeakable gift, eternal life in His Son. Join that great company who sing from the heart, "Praise God from whom all blessings flow," united in their shout of triumph.

Pray For Our Apostolic Faith Bible College

Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentence toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Santification of the Spirit, soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.
Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9.

Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.
