


May President's Corner

King Sooper's Card Update Note: For King Sooper's Cards ONLY; Not Safeway

In order to simplify King Sooper's community giving program they are launching "The Community Rewards" program. No longer will you need to reload gift cards. Starting April 1st for those who want to support our Lodge, you need only use the King Sooper's Loyalty Card.

If you wish to continue to use the Reloadable Gift Card for the convenience of not having to carry cash; you may. But, any money reloaded after March 31st, our Lodge will not receive the credit. The new program will be in service on April 1st.

Once our Lodge Application is approved; we will receive a NPO Number to be used so that any Lodge member with, or without a current King Sooper's Loyalty Card may go online to

www.kingsoopers.com/communityrewards and register their existing Loyalty Card or

and register their existing Loyalty Card or apply for a new Loyalty Card. In addition, once a household member enrolls his or her card; all linked Loyalty Cards within that household will begin earning credits for our Lodge.

Under this new program; King Sooper's will pay out \$10 million annually. Each quarter \$2.5 million will be divided amongst all registered nonprofit organizations with a maximum payment of \$125,000 per quarter. The amount received is based upon the percentage of spending within our Lodge as it relates to the total spending of all participating organizations. The more that our members and supporters (who have registered their Loyalty Cards with our Lodge) are shopping at King Sooper's, the greater each quarter our share will be! Steve
