Buses*	<p>Ensign Bus Services: Number 22,22A,25,33,44,66,73,83, and 88 arrive and depart at Grays Bus Station at appropriate times for the school run both in the morning and afternoon. Grays bus station is a 15 minute walk away from the school. Number 66 also stops in Dock Road, which is a 3 minute walk away from the school. Numbers 83 and 73 also stop at Dock Road, Palmers Avenue and Southend Road. At the most this is a 15 minute walk away from school.</p> <p>First Bus Service: Number 100 and 200 pass through Dock Road at appropriate times for school pickup and drop-off.</p>

Rail* Our nearest train station is Grays. It is a fifteen minute walk from the school to the train station. There are direct trains from all surrounding stations at appropriate times for the school drop-off/pickup.

This is essential due to the fading zig-zag markings and very low kerb.

Many pedestrians and cyclists do use the main vehicular gates and walk across the school car park to cut across buildings rather than sticking to the path as pedestrians have to cross the main vehicle entrance in order to get to the pedestrian entrance, which can be dangerous when drivers use the main vehicle entrance to turn around.</p>

(If poor/Inadequate, please record any details)</p>	<p>Poor The kerbs aren't very high which allows drives to mount the pavement with ease. Paths are narrow and can be obstructed by residents on refuse collection days. It can become a one-way pavement during peak times which forces pedestrians to walk in the road.</p>
<p>What is the quality of the 'SCHOOL' and zig-zag road markings like?</p>	<p>Inadequate Fading and difficult to see, largely ignored. Cones are put out by the site staff every morning/afternoon to ensure parents and public transport are forced to take note but this can result in drivers stopping and abandoning their cars in the middle of the road rather than pulling over. Recent issues seen with cars blocking/part blocking the school gates.</p>
<p>Please record any other obstacles or road layout issues within 500 metres of the school entrance which could be deemed as preventing young people or making it more difficult for them to use sustainable transport on the journey to and from school.</p>	<p>Residents of Manor Road have no garages/drives so they are forced to park on the road. This means that the road is already narrow and becomes highly congested, verging on dangerous, during the peak drop-off/pickup times. It is a dead end road which means that parents turn in the road, often using the largest section of road available to do it - the main school gates. This can make it dangerous for children entering the school by foot - they have to cross the main vehicular entrance in order to reach the pedestrian entrance and drivers don't always take note of children trying to cross the road. Pedestrians are also forced to cross the road between parked cars.</p> <p>The pavement along Manor Road isn't always clear and can become very congested with pedestrians during peak times. This means that children who are cycling/scooting to school are forced to ride in a very busy road, where car doors are opening without warning and cars are turning in an unpredictable manner.</p> <p>At the end of Manor Road there is a cross roads, which again becomes very congested at peak times, with cars parked along both sides of the road and often stopping in the middle of the road and getting out of their cars to drop their children off, leaving their car in an unsuitable place.</p> <p>Cars also park along both sides of Gypsy Lane which, at peak times, renders it a one-way street. This makes it extremely difficult for buses/coaches to travel close enough to the school to drop children at school. This also presents more difficulties for pedestrians/cyclists trying to cross the road - cars moving unpredictably in a one-way street, having to cross between parked cars and very heavy congestion at the cross roads. An application has been made to Thurrock Council for a zebra crossing outside the school to ensure pedestrian safety when crossing the road.</p>

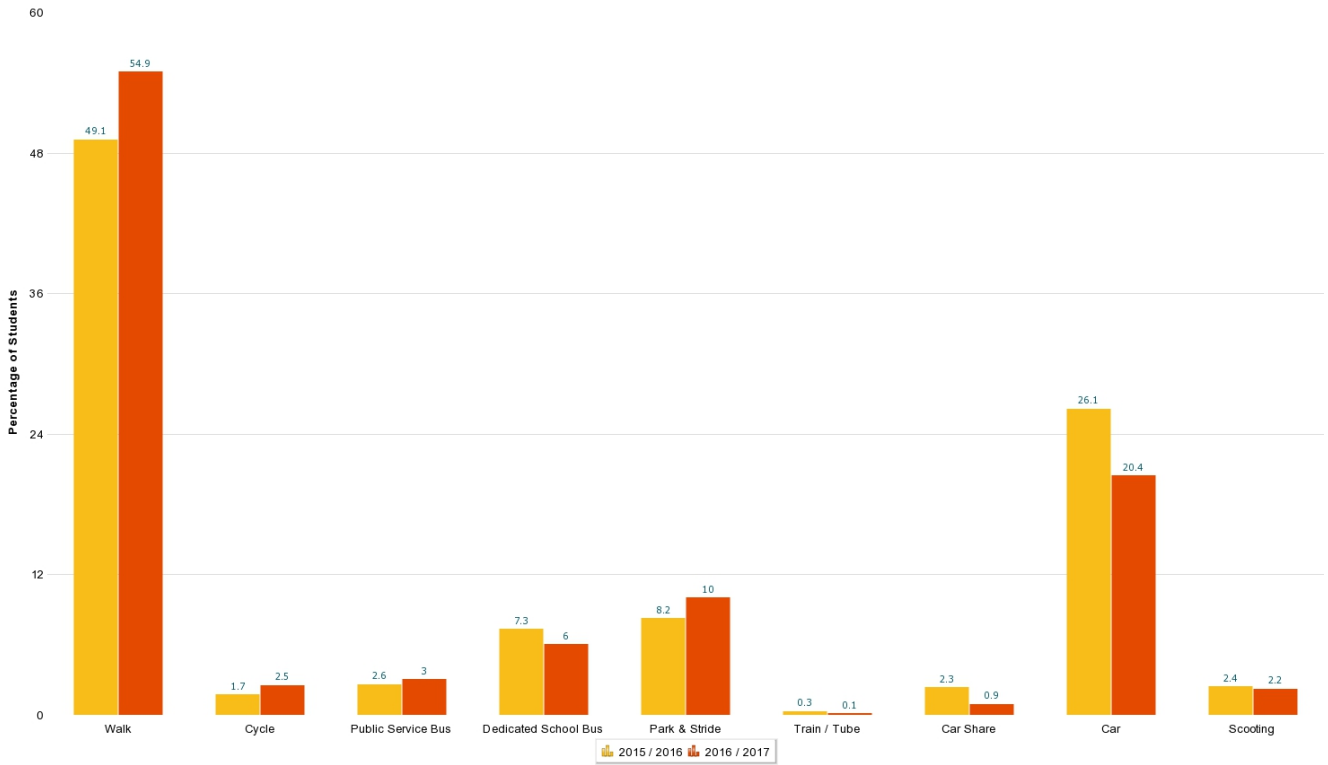
