WHY A COLORADO ELKS YOUTH CAMP?

The Colorado Elks Association members have recently authorized the addition of a new major project that is the start of the journey to establish a “Colorado Elks Youth Camp” by amending our CEA By-Laws. The initial limited funds have been donated to our charitable 501(c)3 corporation “Colorado Elks Charities, Inc.” Those funds have been strictly restricted to the establishment and operation of a youth camp to be owned and operated by our State Association. *A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step* – and we have now taken that step.

EVERY LODGE CAN PARTICIPATE

A youth camp for financially disadvantaged youngsters provides the perfect opportunity for every one of our 55 local Lodges to impact their local community. This impact will occur in a positive way by sending qualifying local children to our own “summer camp.” These will be the children who would otherwise miss the wonderful youth camp experience. It is a way for Colorado Elks to profoundly impact the future of their communities in a beautiful way. Think of it; hundreds of Colorado children receiving a fun and uplifting growth experience as a result of the work of local Elks in their own communities.

COLLATERAL BENEFITS

A youth camp will provide the opportunity for our Elks to provide charitable service with their time in addition to their bank accounts – but don’t take me wrong; the accomplishment of this task will require substantial fund raising.

Annual spring openings and fall closings and winterization will require significant manpower and time commitments from our Members. Those are fulfilling experiences for our volunteers. In addition to the management by our state governing bodies, we will need on site management, transportation to and from the camp by local volunteer Elks; and there will be many other opportunities for significant Member participation. This is a great opportunity to show our cities and towns that truly, **ELKS CARE-ELKS SHARE!**

Imagine the great feeling of participating in a wonderful project that will be owned and operated by our own Colorado Elks Association designated entity. It will be controlled by our elected and designated Elk officials. Imagine holding a state-wide meeting in the camp “Pavilion.” Imagine a cabin constructed by the

skilled hands of your Lodge Members with your Lodge name above the front door. Imagine a facility with swimming, hiking, crafts, and a great social experience for kids from your neighborhood receiving a great growth and maturing experience that you and your Lodge will make possible.

HOW CAN WE DO IT?

We must work as a great team for meeting these goals and visions will not be easy. Fund raising is in the plans. If you know of someone looking for a great way to donate and receive a charitable donation tax deduction, let us know. If you know of someone with suitable land that would like to leave a lasting legacy that will benefit the youth from the 4 corners of our great state, let us know.
