Pastor's Corner

Pastor's Corner + Devotional Combo – Read Judges 5:9-18

HELP! Yep, right out of the gate and to the point: I want to make clear that we need your help. And I'm asking you this personally as your pastor. This may be the most important appeal I have made to you all year – in terms of the specific mission of Puckety Church. A quick story. Our small group recently studied Judges 4 & 5 – the story of Deborah, Barak and Jael. It's a motivating story because God gives his prophetess and judge, Deborah, the command for Barak to deliver Israel from the oppressive king, Jabin. Barak was the first to hesitate, insisting that *she* lead, and he would follow as back-up. She said if they did it like that, the glory and fulfillment would go to another. Then, as if the author wanted to make the



point again, when Deborah was victorious, she called out the particular tribes that sat safely on the sidelines (Reuben, Dan and Asher) saying they had hearts of hesitation and indecision (Judges 5:15-17). Our small group talked at length about how many people in the church can also show hesitation and indecision in the face of something intimidating. We then tried to think and pray about how to overcome that temptation. Well, a present reality has been growing more urgent over the last year. Put simply, the core of leaders in the various ministries of Puckety are close to burnout. Many of them are serving on 2, even 3, of the Church's committees – let alone the other places they are trying to help lead. It's time to hear God's call like he issued through Deborah - "My heart is with those who offer themselves willingly" (Judges 5:9). *Session & Deacons – we have close to 150 people on our membership roll. As a result, there should be little trouble in discerning 9 individuals to serve on the Session. I believe God provides the spiritual gifts for every local congregation to not only fill the biblical positions of leadership (Elders & Deacons), but in other areas as well. Yet, the foundational parts are the boards of Elders and Deacons. If asked to serve, please don't let things like "inexperience" or "feeling unequipped" stop you. Why? Because MANY of the people God called throughout the Scriptures (often the best ones) felt the same way and said so, but God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called. And put simply, we cannot accomplish the mission Christ has revealed to Puckety Church without the committed leadership that lies in the potential areas of our membership.

*A/V Sound & Zoom volunteers – the A/V team has made it clear that if they don't get a few more volunteers to help with the sound booth and Zoom hosting specifically, that the online options we offer (Zoom & Facebook Live) will not be available much longer. We've obviously come a long way to offer these online offerings, so please volunteer – they are happy to provide training and help anyone get acclimated.

***Praise Team and Choir** – our worship teams need more participants as well. The maintenance of divine worship is one of the great ends of the church, and to "Honor God" is the first arm of Puckety's mission. Please contact Lorraine, Rebecca, or myself if there is a way you can plug in regularly to one of our worship teams.

*Other ministry teams - we are at a point where we NEED members of Puckety who are not currently on a

committee to join the standing committees. We are grateful for those who occasionally volunteer for "as needed" community and fellowship events. But I believe – with all my heart because it's in the New Testament witness – that members of any body of Christ are called to be committed to a particular form of regular ministry where their spiritual gifts are engaged and cultivated. Please don't wait to be asked; consider this message the *personal invitation*.

In short, we are humbly asking every member of Puckety to something far more impactful than a New Year's resolution in 2022. We ask you to help our Mission and Vision statements be more than something that sound nice on our publications, more than something we think about theoretically and conceptually. To truly and practically reach our community with the gospel, and transform lives for Christ, it will take every one of us. I'm not exaggerating for effect – I mean that quite literally – it will take every one of us in submission to Christ's Lordship, and the Holy Spirit's leading. So, I thank you all for your faith, willingness and service. God bless you to the glory of his name.

Thank You Upkeep Team and Supportive Friends

As 2021 comes to a close, we would like to take this opportunity to thank the Upkeep Team for the diligent work. Reflecting back, we are happy to see and be able to utilize the results of their accomplishments.

This year in the Conference Room, they replaced the smaller cabinet style TV with a large screen smart TV that they were able to mount on the back wall. The Conference Room carpet was replaced with a commercial grade tile carpet system that will allow for the easy replacement of stained or damaged carpet tiles.

In Faith Hall, the entire old fluorescent lighting system in both the fellowship area and the kitchen, was replaced with new low wattage LED bulbs. This conversion required the complete change out of more than 60 light units. This project was completely done in house at a tremendous savings to the church. In addition, similar lighting systems were put in place in the church hallway off of the sanctuary as well as in the Conference Room.

The Upkeep team was able to see the completion of numerous painting projects and other outdoor projects by supervising this summer's visiting youth work group. This work was done by two separate groups. One from the Annapolis, Maryland area and the other from Lower Burrell and several local neighboring communities. They were great kids and fun to work with.

The biggest challenge of the year was the mowing and landscaping care of the church campus and the cemetery. Since the mowing season was wet the mowing time was extended at both ends. The team confronted numerous equipment challenges as the present equipment is rapidly aging out. The robotic mowers prove to be a blessing by significantly reducing mowing times, while keeping the front areas of the church and manse looking freshly cut. While the robotic mowers are extremely helpful, they still require constant surveillance and careful maintenance. They are much like little children they can misbehave therefore they need constant supervision. Upkeep wishes to thank the ladies for the care of the flower presentation in front of the church and the constant weeding that was done.

In the cemetery we lost one very large tree during a summer storm. Thanks to everyone who swung into action and helped remove the tree from blocking Puckety Church Road.

You may have noticed the new manse roof replacement came to fruition in late October. This was after an extended bidding process followed by a number of conscientious discussions and an investigation comparing asphalt shingle roofs and new technology metal roofing.

A church safety technology system was also put in place, offering another layer of safety against fire, freezing and potential flood damage. This system was provided to us by our insurance company.

MOST IMPORTANTLY, WE WISH TO EXPRESS OUR APPRECIATION OF ALL THE MEMBERS OF THE UPKEEP COMMITTEE FOR THEIR DEDICATED COMMITMENT TO THEIR CHURCH. WE WOULD FURTHER LIKE TO THANK OTHER MEMBERS OF OUR CHURCH FAMILY WHO HAVE STEPPED UP AN VOLUNTEERED IN ASSISTING THE COMMITTEE IN THEIR MISSION. QUITE FRANKLY, WE COULD NOT HAVE DONE THESE THINGS WITHOUT YOU.

ADVENT has started! The Christian year doesn't start on January 1st but with the first day of Advent (often the last Sunday in November). The Christian year is shaped by the life of Christ. Advent is a time of preparation, four weeks to anticipate the birth of Christ, the "coming" (what "Advent" means) of God into the world. Then, there is Christmas time (ironically when much of our culture stops celebrating 'Christmas') – Dec. 25 through January 6 (Epiphany). If we don't

intentionally observe and walk through the measured pace of Advent, we'll have a harder time being faithful during the times of Lent and Easter. The church seasons aren't just a religious way to break up time – they help us remember the prophecies, and *rediscover their fulfillment*, in the birth of Christ, his life and death and resurrection, followed by our receiving the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) so his life can continue through us. So, let's start WELL! In Advent, "we expectantly wait for the One who has already come. We anticipate the promised justice of God's new world. We hope for the restoration of the afflicted, the tormented and the grieving, yet we delight that healing has come in Christ, God's 'righteous branch.' We yearn for the barren deserts of our inner cities to flourish, yet we laud the desert Rose that has bloomed. We acclaim the child born to lead us into the promised land!" (from *PresbyterianMission.org*). Even so, come Lord Jesus. Amen.

Bethlehem was the focus of an amazing prophecy by the prophet Micah.

Micah tells us that the story of Bethlehem is about a place. But, it is also about a plan.

The words "from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule Israel" tell us that God has a glorious plan for humanity and Bethlehem was a part of his plan. When God saved His people out of their bondage in Egypt, by the blood of a Lamb, He revealed a little more of His plan. When He gave Israel the Law and the sacrificial ceremonies, He was revealing more of His plan. Every aspect of the Tabernacle, the priesthood and the sacrifices

revealed more and more of God's plan. Through the mouths of the prophets God gave insight into His plan.

Then Micah revealed the birth place of the Messiah. He shared where the King would be born. He told us that the One Who would fulfill the plan would come from the little town of Bethlehem.

This plan involved God becoming human. For Him to come into this world and to live as a man. Micah closes this verse with these words concerning the Christ: "whose origin is from of old, from ancient days." These words reveal the truth that this One This One Who would be born in Bethlehem was no ordinary Man.

Micah tells us that while He may be coming out of Bethlehem, He is eternal! He may be born in Bethlehem, but His beginning is not there. He is Eternal!!!

O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; Cast out our sin, and enter in, be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel! Amen and Amen!




