Vanities, faucets and lights have all been replaced in the Sanctuary bathrooms. Sanctuary basement door has been installed and will be painted soon. A bouquet of roses means sincere gratitude, whereas a single rose amplifies the meaning of the color (a single red rose means "I REALLY love you"). The other June flower is **honeysuckle**, which is a strong symbol for the everlasting bonds of love.
