

Grace & Peace From the Pastor's Desk

"God has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God?" Micah 6:8

Tucked deep in the pages of the Old Testament is the book of Micah; 7 chapters of prose written in lines as if poetry. The book begins by warning Israel and Judah about the invasion from Assyria because they are not keeping their covenantal relationship with God. Israel was suffering from evil and unfaithful leadership, and Judah was in a seesaw pattern with a "good" king followed by an evil king, with the cycle continuing until the Babylonian diaspora.

We sometimes hear from the prophet Micah in the season of Advent, just before Christmas, because the prophecy of the birth of the Messiah in Bethlehem is found in chapter 5, verses 2-5. Following this is a clear description of what living in the kingdom of God is supposed to entail. The book ends with encouragement that God is faithful in good times and bad, staying near to us even when we have chosen to stray. Judgement and restoration is the story told by the prophet Micah.

Tucked deeply into its message is the concept that how the poor and lowly are treated is important. Unjust business dealings, robbery, mistreatment of women and children and a government that lives in luxury off the hard work of its nation's peoples will not survive. God is not looking for burnt offerings or animal sacrifices, God wants us, requires us, to be just, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God.

We, as were the Hebrew people, are warned against self-serving motives, and the selfish gathering of wealth and riches. We, as were the Hebrew people, are warned that God is not someone to be trifled with. God is to be adored, held in awe, and a healthy fear, knowing that God is powerful enough to wipe out humanity but gracious enough to refrain from doing so.

The book of Micah leads us to ponder these questions: Where does injustice dwell in your own life? Who are the lowly in your life? Do you need a call toward repentance, like the people of Israel and Judah did?

Immanuel Lutheran has been donating to The Bethany Outreach Program annual fundraiser for many years. 2023 is no different.

The Bethany Outreach Center is a central location for social service connections. They reach out to the local community with open arms and are a family to those who are lonely, unloved and misunderstood. They work to empower low-income families through various enrichment classes, so that they may find jobs and fulfillment. Week-

ly food and clothing distributions are also offer to those in need.

Once a year, The Bethany Outreach Center holds a fundraiser, with the hopes of raising donations to support the on-going expenses associated with aiding the local community. This year, they will be the beneficiaries of the Drive Out Hunger Golf Tournament. This is the 6th Annual Harbor Ridge Open, held on July 30th at Harbor Ridge Golf Course in Harbor Creek, Pennsylvania.



Earth Friendly Celebrations

Here are some ideas for "greening-up" your next get together:

- Substitute throw-away plastic table covers with bedding sheets (lots of great designs) or butcher/craft paper (furnish crayons or makers for guests to decorate)
- Use paper lanterns (that can be collapsed to use again) instead of balloons
- Choose party favors wisely:
 - o Select paper bags rather than plastic
 - Give a book to young attendees, related to the party theme
 - Give a photo frame (can be decorated) with a picture of the guest(s)
- Consider "no gifts/hostess thank-yous" or better yet, encourage attendees to bring a donation for the area animal shelter or food pantry
- Substitute plastic tableware and straws with paper goods (compostable ones are best!)
- Having a large number of guests? Provide markers or labels for their cups, so only one per person is needed.
- Provide labeled trash bags, separating landfill and recyclable items.
