Bring your own project to work on, or make this sweet gift bag and/or a key fob for a holiday gift. Materials will be supplied for the bags. For the key fob, please bring 2 coordinating fabrics 3"x14" and 1 piece of batting 1"x14". Hardware will be supplied. Just bring a sewing machine and basic supplies (including a rotary cutter and small mat).



### Sarah Bond Workshop - "Release the Geese"

January 13 – 10 am to 4 pm \$50 for members

This class is not a "make this quilt" class, although it is perfectly reasonable to make one of the samples, and I will give you directions to make them as displayed. It is really designed to provide you with elements and techniques that you can use to design your own quilt.

We will do circular flying geese using a basic paper piecing method. I will provide you with patterns for various types of circular flying geese with clockwise and counterclockwise orientations. We will also do some straight geese with a quick piecing, no-waste technique that you can use in various ways.

Then we will look at ways to combine your straight flying geese with your circular flying geese to achieve any number of possible variations.

#### Required supplies to bring with you:

- rotary cutter
- cutting mat
- 24" ruler
- pins
- paper & pencil for notes
- Fabric: Because this is a workshop/design class, I can't tell you exactly how much yardage you will need. But if you are going for a scrappy look, fat quarters are great. If you have a particular line of fabrics you want to use, bring them all along and make your choices as you design. Be sure to bring one or more fabrics to serve as the background for your geese.

Rotary cutter, ruler and mat

Pencil

Small iron and ironing mat

Collage Fabrics - i.e.: flowers, birds, leaves, bugs, fish, animals, really anything that you find interesting

Background fabric/fabrics

Heat and Bond lite or similar product that can be sewn thru



# Courthouse Quilters Guild Challenge 2019 "What is Black and White and ????? all over?"

The Challenge for 2019 will be to create something using only Black, White, and Shades (GRAY ONLY) maybe prints must contain no other colors. If you choose to, you may add one color, it must be a solid.

Ribbons will be given in the following three categories: (at our 31th Anniversary Celebration- April 14, 2019)

- 1. Black and whites with or without gray quilt.
- 2. Black and whites, with or without gray and one other solid color quilt.
- 3. Others items (clothing, purses, fabric sculpture et al.) in color combination 1 or 2.

The quilt must be begun after November 11, 2018 and the challenge will be judged at the April 14, 2019 guild meeting (31th Anniversary Celebration).

You will be given a paper label to fill out when you bring your quilt. You will be asked for this information:

- 1. Did you design the piece yourself? If not, who was the designer?
- 2. Did you quilt the piece yourself? If not, who quilted it?

If your quilt has a label, cover it with a piece of cloth. Bring your quilt in a pillowcase or other closed bag.

#### **CLARIFICATIONS:**

Black and white and shades (gray only) may be prints must contain no other colors.

#### Featured Member - Patricia Crowell



Meet new member AND new recording secretary, Patricia Crowell. Patricia started quilting two years ago in August. She can pinpoint the month exactly, because she had a specific reason to take up quilting. Here's the story: Her parents had been taking care of her dog and had gotten very attached. The dog died while with them, and her parents were terribly upset. To distract her mother, Patricia

suggested that they work to finish one of the quilts that her mother had started years earlier. As they worked together, Patricia, who had meant only to support her mother, learned the skills of quilting and caught the bug. She says that the quilt turned out to be "imprecise" and not up to her mother's usual standards, but Patricia went out and bought a sewing machine, and a quilter was born.

She also bought herself a book: 100 Modern Quilt Blocks by Tula Pink. She thinks of herself as a modern quilter now, but she also admires traditional quilts and expects to find ways to combine the old and new as she continues to sew. Her favorite quilt appeared in our 2018 show. It is her first big quilt, a queen. Now she is finishing her 100 Modern Block quilt and being coached by Jo Kuchera on quilting styles and skills.



When she is not quilting, Patricia joins her husband in making music. He is a singer/songwriter, and she is a backup singer and marketer for his recordings and concerts. For a while,

they had a band called the Working Class Hussys and traveled to Texas and Nashville to perform.

Now they are focused on restoring a 1880's house in Lambertville. She can't wait to move in and set up a quilt studio.



#### **Minutes**

October 21, 2018 4:00 – 5:30

In attendance: Jude M, Andrea C., Patty G., Cass G., Ellen H., Marla K., Stephanie G. Cathie G., Joan L., Mary Rigby.

President: Meeting called to order at 4:36.

A motion was made by Ellen to approve last month's minutes. Seconded by Stephanie. Motion carried.

The Board voted to put the show back to 3 days so membership can be involved in the decision. Jude made a move to revise back to 3 days and Cathie seconded. Motion carried.

There will be a special show meeting including all show chairs to determine how to proceed for the next show. The goal is to meet the week of Jan 7<sup>th</sup> for discussion of the show so we can present to the guild in February.

There have been no nominations for President. We have to fold or change the by-laws if no one takes this position. Discussion about the duties of the President and what the responsibilities are. We will vote on the nominations we have tonight.

Hospitality:: Discussion about who may do hospitality and ways to get things set up and cleaned up. Andrea will ask at the beginning of this meeting for five people to volunteer to help clean up tonight.

#### Vice President:

Marla will announce the challenge tonight and a short survey will be distributed to try to determine what programs to bring to the guild.

Marla found the error in the ticket wristbands. In the end we sold about 900.

The person who was supposed to do our workshop did not show up for the workshop due to a calendaring snafu but will be at the meeting for the lecture.

Treasurer: We have almost 41K in the bank. Patty is going to do the year-end tallies before turning it over to the next Treasurer.

The board is hoping to get a report and hear the results of the show in the very near future. Stephanie is still hoping to get a survey monkey regarding the show to the membership.

Jude: Would like to make up about 15 kits for members to take home. She will try it out in April. We still have bins of quilts that Andrea has been storing and we wan to distribute them. Joan suggested that a Locota Native American tribe in South Dakota need quilts. Mary and Joan will take care of the distribution.

Circulation: A lot of people were asking who won the raffle quilt. Kathy posted past photos on my Grove and Facebook and on Cathie's computer so there are multiple copies in case of a failure. Steph asked about separating the Guilds email account from her account so that people don't respond to her AND the guild. She is working on that.

The webpage has been updated by Cathie so all the show info has been removed.

Newsletter-Ellen: In January we will go to every other month for the newsletter. Cathie feels that moving the newsletter to every two months may be problematic because she depends on it for valid information. In the "off" month a one page fact sheet will be distributed.

Library: Patty- She acquired some books from the Newtown Quilt Guild that are now available to our membership.

Publicity: Joan. Publicity is going fine.

Stephanie moved to end the meeting and Ellen seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 5:34
