January 19, 2020 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Jn 1:29-34

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Amnesia? Has John forgotten? Two times in the gospel today John the Baptist says "I did not know him" about Jesus. What does he mean? Isn't the 'Baptist' the same person who in the womb leapt for joy at the sound of the Blessed Mother Mary's greeting because of the Lord Jesus within her (Luke 1:43-44)? Presumably, Mary and Elizabeth (and their children) as kinswomen, remained in contact after their children's births. Here, suddenly, John doesn't know Jesus? Understandably, people question the meaning of John's two declarative statements about 'not knowing Jesus'. John's denial here has nothing in common with the infamous denial of Jesus by Peter later in the gospel (Luke 22:57-60). What John means here is that his knowledge of Jesus' divine identity is not dependent on any family connection such as Jesus being his cousin. John knows Jesus first and foremost through the Holy Spirit. John is blunt and crystal clear about his promotion of Jesus being the Messiah, not out of any biological family bias. John is saying that his praise and exaltation of Jesus has nothing to do with any family or kin business. John is not advancing a family brand, growing a family dynasty (like the Herods & Caesars of the world). John is not engaging in spiritual nepotism, hiring his family and promoting their causes. In fact, John is going to great lengths to distance himself and his biological connections to Jesus. John is declaring that God revealed Jesus' divine identity to him (especially in the womb). Luke 1:41 says that when "Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, declared..." Keep in mind that while the Holy Spirit is filling Elizabeth, also right in that same body of hers is the infant John. The Holy Spirit gives John the conviction of Jesus being the Messiah! John didn't come up with Jesus' identity on his own. John always insists on the divine origin of his knowledge of Jesus. John didn't make it up. God revealed it to John through the Holy Spirit. That is why also two times John says ""I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from the sky and remain upon him" in verse 32 and 33. (Another two times in John 1:29 & 1:36 John will declare two times that Jesus is the expected 'Lamb of God'.) John is making clear that the Holy Spirit made known to him that 'Yes, Jesus is the one. We all saw the Holy Spirit as a dove descend from heaven and rest upon Jesus.' So the opening of the skies and the dove's coming down and resting on Jesus is the divine sign of confirmation that John passes on in his declarations. It is not just a hunch of his, that Jesus is the Messiah. John is saying, "I have it from God-the Holy Spirit that Jesus is the One-not my own, but God's divine pronouncement says it so!

Like the profound humility of John that was on display in last week's gospel when he refused to 'baptize Jesus' because Jesus was the 'greater one coming after me', John maintains his lowly attitude of simply being a 'servant of God'. A meek disciple of a meek master! This comes out in the chosen title of 'Lamb' for Jesus as the source of meekness and humility. God put it in John's ear and heart to declare Jesus the Messiah with the title 'Lamb of God', as a simple, sacrificial servant. John declares this two times in verse 1:29 and 1:36. This evokes the prophecy of Isaiah 11:6 about the lamb whose peaceful presence overcomes the violence of the lion, the patient and gentle servant of God praised in Isaiah 53:7 and the atoning, life-giving lamb of the Passover-Exodus (Exodus 12:7-8). Visions of this Divine Lamb's glory are found in the Book of Revelation chapters 5-7. So our humble messenger John recognizes our humble Savior Jesus. John's witness is not human testimony, it is divine testimony. The Holy Spirit is the proof! Jesus never jumps up on a pedestal; and says 'I am God'. No, He allows the Holy Spirit to work in each person's heart, coming to recognize Jesus as God by felt word and seen deed. This is why right after John spotlights Jesus as Lamb of God, and the two prospective disciples approach Jesus inquiring about his credentials, He simply responds, "Come and See" (John 1:39). There is no pomp and parade to identify Jesus. We only need to trust the Holy Spirit to plant conviction in our hearts, and to pay attention to our 'given experience' of Him in our lives, and we will know that Jesus is God. He is the ONE. What a Savior we have and what a model he sets as an example for us to follow. Jesus will later describe himself as 'Good Shepherd' (John 10), yet what a faithful leader we have first to identify Himself as a 'lamb' to show his intimate understanding of our weakness and vulnerability. He will later, send out his disciples commissioned as 'lambs among wolves' (Luke 10:3), yet Jesus assure us that He will provide securely for all needs among our dangers. We need only to rest in His care, and stay by his side. As Lamb and Shepherd, even in deprivation, He will provide. He alone 'restores our soul' (Ps 23:3).
