2}name the numbers, 3) lay them in order

Find the letter K-King, Q-Queen, J-Jack, and letter A=1

Everyday say prayers of thanks

At mealtime, bedtime, and whenever..

Read some from your prayer box.

Build with blocks, boxes, legos, magnatiles, and????
