LOCAL COASTAL PROGRAM UPDATE:

The City's Local Coastal Program project team has prepared a draft of the Coastal Hazards Adaptation Plan (AP), which goes to the California Coastal Commission next. This draft outlines a wide range of potential adaptation strategies the City can deploy as future coastal conditions warrant. A public workshop will be scheduled soon to share and receive public input on the draft document.

The project team will be at **Buccaneer Beach on Friday, January 10 at 8:00 a.m.**, and at the parking lot at Wisconsin St. and **The Strand on Sunday, February 9 at 8:30 a.m.** to see the impact of the king tides, and welcome your input on the stretches of coastline most impacted by tidal and storm.

DID YOU KNOW....

Did you know.... that January is the end of the best time to trim your trees and bushes? From October to New Year's timeframe is good, but we are so busy with Holiday plans most of us don't think about trimming trees.



Many people wait until it gets warmer when they begin to think about gardening to start trimming trees. Spring may be easier, but it's not good for nesting birds and animals! In January birds are not nesting yet, or have not yet returned their vacations.

I have a mocking bird that routinely nests in my sour orange tree. She and her mate will return when the insects become abundant to feed their babies. One year I thought they abandoned the nest and I trimmed the tree... just as the bird arrived with new sticks to make renovations!

Spring is baby season, and most song birds have hatched young by mid-March and setting incubating starts 11-14 days earlier. Building or repairing nests must begin several weeks before that. So, if you trim trees in January, you will fit in with this natural cycle and not interrupt the lives of neighborhood wildlife.

New Year's Resolution: trim trees early!

HWY 5 EXPANSION APPROVED:

The California Coastal Commission approved the addition of one new High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lane in each direction of I-5 from north of Palomar Airport Road to north of the Cassidy Street over crossing. New signage, landscaping and lighting are also planned. The North Coast Corridor plan, submitted jointly by Caltrans and SANDAG, is expected to begin in Fall 2020 and be complete in 2022. provides free materials for Oceanside residents - just bring proof of your residency.

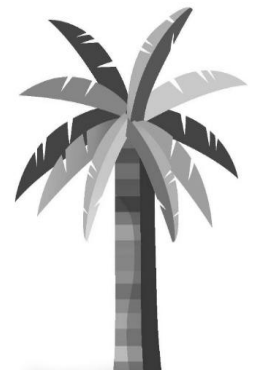
Moody's has rock, gravel, recycled fill dirt, DG, compost, vermicast tea! Residents can pick up sand and sandbags too!

The City of Oceanside has opened a new public parking garage steps from the beach! The SALT building at 371 N. Cleveland Street between Pier View Way and Civic Center Dr is now open to the public!

This new public garage has 340 public parking spaces and charges \$5 all day or \$3 for two-hour parking in designated spots. Hours are from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. daily.
