**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF  
HAMPTON TOWNSHIP 2016 ANNUAL BUDGET**

**ROLL CALL VOTE:** Committeeman Timothy Dooley, yes; Committeeman David Hansen, yes; Committeeman Scott MacKenzie, yes; and Mayor Philip Yetter, yes. Motion Carried.

**RESOLUTIONS**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to adopt the following resolution.

**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF THE  
RECYCLING TONNAGE GRANT APPLICATION**

**WHEREAS,** The Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grants may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local separation and recycling programs; and

**WHEREAS,** It is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue to expand existing programs, and

**WHEREAS,** The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection is promulgating recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

**WHEREAS,** The recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

**WHEREAS,** A Resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for such tonnage grants will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of Hampton Township to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

**WHEREAS,** Such a Resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.


**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Hampton that Hampton Township hereby endorses the submission of the recycling tonnage grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Karen Hansen to ensure that the application is properly filed, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the monies received from the recycling tonnage grant be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be solely for the purpose of recycling.

**KITTATINNY REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL – RE: REQUEST TO USE  
HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION FIELDS**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township DPW Manager D. Bayles recommended that the issue referenced above go before the Township Recreation Committee for consideration and then referred back to the Township Committee for an update. If necessary, a subcommittee can convene at the Municipal Office to discuss the matter further with Kittatinny Regional High School Athletic Director Mr. Carroll.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman S. MacKenzie and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to direct the above referenced matter to the Hampton Township Recreation Committee for consideration and followed up with a review by the Township Committee.

**SANDYSTON TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to authorize the Hampton Township DPW to provide Street Sweeping Services to Kittatinny Regional High School on the school's main access road and the school parking lots at a rate of \$450.00 for the first 4 hours, \$100.00 for each additional hour and a disposal rate of \$10.00 per ton.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman S. MacKenzie and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize Township Engineer H. Pellow to prepare specifications for upgrades to the Hampton Township Senior and Community Center, in accordance with the American Disability Act guidelines, for the purposes of going out to bid.

**KITTATINNY BAND BOOSTERS CALENDAR RAFFLE AT  
KITTATINNY REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL**

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to approve a Calendar Raffle for the Kittatinny Band Boosters, as referenced above.

**KITTATINNY BAND BOOSTERS 50/50 OFF PREMISE RAFFLE TO BE HELD ON  
APRIL 30, 2016 AT KITTATINNY REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL**

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to approve an Off Premise Raffle for the Kittatinny Band Boosters, as referenced above.

**NEW SIGN FOR THE HAMPTON TOWNSHIP SENIOR AND COMMUNITY CENTER**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Mr. Art Frisbie is preparing a quote to design new signage for the *Hampton Township Community and Senior Center*. The Township Committee made a decision to rename the building, *The Daniel Coranoto Community and Senior Center*, in honor of Committeeman Daniel Coranoto, who passed away last May. Committeeman Coranoto served on the Township Committee for 20 years. In addition, he served on the Township Board of Health, Township Recreation Committee, and Township Planning Board.

**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP COMPLEX RE: CONSTRUCTION  
OF NEW WALKING PATH**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she contacted the Hardyston Township Recreation Committee regarding costs associated with a walking path that Hardyston Township constructed on their municipal grounds. The Hardyston DPW paved the path using their township-owned paving machine. Township Administrator E. Klose inquired about a Shared Services Agreement with Hardyston Township to pave the path that is planned for the Hampton Township Municipal Park. Hardyston Township officials expressed an interest in entering into such an agreement. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that the Hampton Township DPW would be able to excavate the area prior to paving.

Township Administrator E. Klose suggested contacting the Hampton Township Board of Education once the Hampton Township 2016 Municipal Budget has been finalized to discuss the location of the walkway. Committeeman T. Dooley stated that he plans to attend a Hampton Township Board of Education Meeting at the McKeown Elementary School and would raise the issue with school officials. Township Administrator E. Klose confirmed that the Walking Path Fund currently has a balance of \$60,000, with the possibility of an additional \$15,000 saved from the year-end 2015 Recreation Budget.

**DISCUSSION**

Township Administrator E. Klose offered to lend her treadmill to the township so that the employees could use it during the lunch hour at the Hampton Township Municipal Building. The machine could easily be located in the Municipal Conference Room.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize the Township DPW to pick up the treadmill and deliver it to the municipal building and to permit township employees to use the machine at specified times.

Mayor P. Yetter stated that he and Township Administrator E. Klose recently attended the New Jersey League of Municipalities (NJLM) Annual Legislative Day in Trenton along with Mrs. Marie Coranoto and Mrs. Christina . The NJLM posthumously honored Hampton Township

Committeeman Daniel Coranoto with an award for his 20 years of service on the Hampton Township Committee, as well as his years of service as a NJLM Officer.

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Mayor P. Yetter stated that he and Township Administrator E. Klose recently met with the newly appointed Northern New Jersey State Parks Manager, Joshua Osowsky, to discuss needed repairs to a problematic culvert in Hampton Township.

**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE**

HTVFR President V. Rumsey stated that Newton Memorial Hospital plans to honor seven HTVFR EMS volunteers at their Annual Heart and Soul Dinner at Persona Farms. The CPR efforts of these volunteers were directly responsible for saving the lives of several patients.

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HTVFR officials are in the process of getting quotes for a new stove for Fire Station #1.

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Recently HTVFR sent out their Annual Fund Drive Letter and the response from residents has been very good.

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HTVFR President V. Rumsey and HTVFR Chief D. Gunderman both provided information regarding two separate house fires that HTVFR responded to over the past week on Route 519 and Halsey Road. The fire damage was extensive in both cases, but all members of both households were able to escape unharmed.

Both of the families owned pets and most of them survived the fires. Two cats initially survived the fire after receiving oxygen at the scene by HTVR EMS. The cats were transported to the Newton Animal Hospital (NAH) by the owners for further treatment, but they later died from their injuries.

HTVFR Officers raised concerns about admission procedures used by the facility in emergencies. Because NAH acts as Hampton Township's Pound, Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she would contact the Newton Animal Hospital to discuss the matter further.

**A MOTION** was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, for Township Administrator E. Klose to contact the Newton Animal Hospital to discuss their policies relating to emergency admissions.

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HTVFR President V. Rumsey stated the Fire Department is hoping to replace Vehicle #62 in the next year or two.

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Officials from Hampton Township and HTVFR discussed a fire truck that Hampton Township donated to the Swartswood Fire Department in 1991 before the creation of HTVFR. At the time, Swartswood responded to fire calls in Hampton.

The Swartswood Fire Department recently disbanded. Stillwater officials are in the process of trying to distribute the fire department's assets, including the fire truck that was purchased by Hampton Township. HTVFR V. Rumsey explained that the Swartswood Fire Department Bylaws state that when the department disbands, assets shall be returned to the original sponsors. Township Administrator E. Klose is in the process of investigating the matter further.

HTVFR President V. Rumsey stated that most of the equipment on the truck has been removed by the Swartswood Fire Department. Replacement parts would cost approximately \$91,000. The Hampton Township Committee discussed the possibility of donating the truck to a fire department in need using the resources of the local Rotary Club. Several years ago, the Rotary Club arranged to have one of HTVFR older fire trucks shipped to a fire department in the Caribbean.

**A MOTION** was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, for Township Administrator E. Klose to send a letter to the Swartswood Fire Department Officials requesting that they release Fire Truck #821 to Hampton Township.

**A MOTION** was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, for Township Administrator E. Klose to contact the Rotary Club and inquire about donating the fire truck to a fire department in need of a vehicle.


