

The Assumption

Stories of how Mary died and went to heaven have been circulating in the church since the second century. Around the year 600 Emperor Maurice set the feast day on August 15 in the Roman empire. In 1950 Pipe Pius XII proclaimed the Assumption an article of faith. Here are a few lines from *A New Catechism* to help explain its significance: "Mary has already been raised from the dead, body and soul. Of the other dead we may only say that they will be made alive, they are about to arise, but we acknowledge that Mary is already glorified."

"Just as Christ's resurrection is effective among us through his forceful, vivid presence in the life of the world, so too, is the glory or the 'Assumption' of Mary...We can experience the presence of Christ and Mary by living on earth in the Spirit of Christ and by speaking to them in prayer. The same may be said of the other dead. Some great saints and good people are more powerfully present than others. New School Year to Begin August 21, 2019

It is hard to believe our summer vacation is over and school will soon be back in session. As the new academic year begins, Saint Benedict School celebrates the accomplishments that our School has made and looks forward to another year of growth. We celebrate, too, the commitments and sacrifices that parents are making to provide their children with an excellent Catholic Education. We extend a special welcome to the students who have enrolled at Saint Benedict School for the 2019-2020 academic year. We pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and inspire all of our students, administrators, faculty, and staff as we continue to offer quality Catholic Education in Carrolltown.

Traffic Patterns During the School Year

In an effort to insure the safety of Saint Benedict students who walk to school, ride the bus, or are dropped off by their parents, the following traffic patterns are to be observed: (1) All buses will drop the students off directly in front of the School building. (2) All parents who drive their children to School are to enter the Church parking lot from Main Street. They are to drop the kindergarten students off at Saint Scholastica Center; and students in grades 1 through 8 are to be dropped off at the east end of the driveway between the rectory and the School. Parents of children participating in the pre-kindergarten program should park in the parking lot and escort their child to and from the School building. All vehicles are to exit the property at Church Street. (3) During School hours, Parishioners and visitors are expected to enter the parking lot from Main Street as well. They are also to exit the property at Church Street.

State Law

According to Pennsylvania law, school districts are obligated to provide transportation for students whose parents choose to send their child(ren) to a private school. Many students who attend Saint Benedict School are provided school bus transportation through the Cambria Heights School District. If families reside within the boundaries of another school district, however, and they would like for their child(ren) to attend Saint Benedict School, the school district in which they reside is obligated by law to provide for the child(ren)'s transportation.
