

Education and Formation

Families in Faith:

Our mission is to form missionary disciples that includes everyone, regardless of age, family structure, vocation, or choice of school system.

(1). **Sunday morning Faith Formation** - - from September to mid-May at 9:30-10:45 am. It

includes structured sessions for ages 4-18 and a variety of programs and faith sharing opportunities for adults. Volunteers are always needed as Catechists, Aides and kitchen helpers.

(2). **Sacramental Preparation**: Specific preparation programs are available for Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. Support these ministries by being a Sponsor, serving at receptions or decorating for them.

RCIA:

This process prepares children, teens and adults for initiation into the Catholic faith. RCIA is meant for those never baptized; were baptized in other Christian faith communities; baptized Catholics but never celebrated any other sacraments. Sessions run from Labor Day to following Easter each Thursday 6:00-7:30 pm.
