June 30, 2019 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 9:51-62

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Now, we know why Jesus nick-named James and John the "Sons of Thunder" when he called them to serve Him as apostles in Mark 3:17. When these two brothers show up, count on fireworks. Every group has got one or two. They are the 'live wires' (shaque and bern?) among the apostles, who ask Jesus today if He wants them to "call down fire from heaven to consume" a Samaritan village who rejects them (Lk 9:54). These are the same two brothers who boldly (arrogantly?) presume to ask for the seats of glory, right and left, beside Jesus in the Kingdom (Mark 10:37). Of course, Jesus checks their impulsivity by 'rebuking' them (Lk 9:55). This is the Jesus who gave the mission commands in Luke 9:5 "those who do not welcome you, when you leave that town, shake the dust from your feet in testimony against them." Shake the dust, or 'brush it off' is what Jesus commands. Do not get into a scrap or fray with the town. Just move on. Next Sunday, we will hear those exact mission commands from Jesus as he sends out the 72 disciples (same basic command she gave to the 12). If a town rejects the disciples, Jesus told them to keep mission-focus, and take up new ground. Move on to the next; there is always more ground to gain, than to try to prove right or redress a past personal insult. Kingdom Work for God is so abundant and the gospel's proclamation is so much more needed than the petty soothing of a personal slight or defending one's ego. As Robert DeNiro says, "Foe-get about it!"

I remember playing baseball as a kid and when we were batting and were beamed (Pitcher threw ball at us hitting our body), our first base coach always ran toward us shouting, 'Get up, and get to first, walk it off'. Of course, he was trying to work out the burn of the ball's hit on our body, but also to walk us away from a 'heated fight' with the pitcher who intentionally hit us. 'Walk it off' was his way of saying, 'shake off the dust'. Stay focused on the game. So Jesus rebukes James and John and their vengeance seeking, and directs them to keep at work proclaiming the Kingdom of God. Been rejected? Well, guess what? There are twenty more other towns primed and ready to receive our message of God's kingdom, so let's get on to them. Resentment is self-sabotage, or as many have said, it is like drinking poison and expecting your enemy to die. Of course Jesus showed countless examples of 'shaking off dust' to his disciples (think of his scourging and crucifixion). Jesus embodied his teaching perfectly in Luke 4:29-30 when the town people of Nazareth "rose up, drove him out, and led him to the brow of the hill...., to hurl him down headlong. But he passed through the midst of them and went away." Jesus didn't stand and argue. He didn't taunt them and return insult for insult. He simply brushed it off, and went on His way.

I love how the gospel reading ends by Jesus calling the disciples to follow Him without distractions or conditions. Yet several of them offer excuses, refusing to go on mission (rejecting Him). How does Jesus respond to these even more personal rejections by His own followers? Jesus knew well what it meant to be betrayed even by his most personal followers. Again, He simply calls it what it is: Are they not up to it or not capable? He let them go and moved on. Maybe He called them again later, or just left a card with them. Jesus knows, those will not be the only people to refuse His call. He stays 'mission focused'! The gospel today began with the line "Jesus resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51). Jerusalem is the destination for Him, and nothing will pull Jesus away or hold Him back from accomplishing that mission's end. Jesus sets the example of keeping faith (another phrase for being focused) by setting His GPS (Go Proclaim Salvation) to Jerusalem. His inner compass of the Father's Will leads him without deviation to Jerusalem where He accomplishes the mission of dying on the cross and rising anew on the third day. His true North is our redemption and peace. Thanks be to Him, He remained steadfast to the Father's Direction. Do we? Jesus sums up his teaching in the last verse "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62). I drive a lot and it seems like every so often, on a parkway I will see the painted line on the edge of the road squiggle off right or off left and I wonder what pulled the paint operator's eyes away from his job. Maybe a wasp in the cab or the smell of lunch, or worse, the sound of screeching tires behind him. But whatever it is was, he/she obviously took their eye off the road or hand off the plow. But following Jesus, we want to keep all eyes forward on Him.
