CHRIST IS RISEN – DEATH IS CONQUERED!

Rom. 6:3-11; Matt. 28:1-10; Acts 10:34, 37-43; Col. 3:1-4; John 20:1-9

ALLELUIA! The Lord has indeed risen as He said! On the 5th Sunday of Lent Christ told us that, "...unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." In the Nicene Creed (Profession of Faith) we profess: "We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come." Apostle Paul, writing to the Corinthians about the living tradition of the Resurrection which he had learned after his conversion to Christianity, said: "In the first place, I have passed on to you what I myself received: that Christ died for our sins, as Scripture says; that He was buried; that He was raised on the third day, according to the Scriptures; that He appeared to Cephas and then to the Twelve...This is what we preach and this is what you (and I) believed" (1Cor. 15: 3-11). The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event with manifestations that were historically verified, as the New Testament bears witness. Indeed, this is what is preached to us and it is truly what we believe. Thus Paul further contends, "if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is empty and our belief comes to nothing... And if Christ has not been raised, your faith gives you nothing, and you are still in sin. Also those who fall asleep in Christ are lost."

Rejoice, Christ is risen from the dead! Thus, the dead are not lost; neither will you and I be lost, because "the God Who raised the Lord Jesus (from death) will also raise us with His power" (1Cor. 6:14). Easter is the feast of life. This is the day, which demonstrates that "our belief has not been futile." Christ has risen from the dead! At the Easter vigil we lit our candles and celebrated Christ as our light and that of the whole world. This celebration draws on the symbolism of light versus darkness - truth versus falsehood – hope versus despair and life versus death. The fire that we lit on Easter night burns out the works of darkness in us and restores us to a new life in Christ. We, who have been dead through sin, are now freed from the grasp of Satan. Christ has risen as He said! Christ, our light, has risen from the dead, let us rejoice and be glad! For people who walk in darkness - sin, ignorance and hopelessness - Christ shines as a bright light upon us. On this night, all the baptized renew their baptismal promises because through baptism we have died to our old ways and have been raised up to a new life in Christ.

Alleluia, Christ is risen! You have been raised with Him, therefore, "seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." In other words, do not be captivated by the glitter of life or be caught up with those things that may distract you from paying attention to the things of heaven. God has raised Christ, our light, from the dead, hence; let no part of you remain in darkness. As a believer, throughout this year, do all you can to bring the light of the risen Christ to those who have turned their backs on Him because of one reason or the other. Like Joseph of Arimathea who donated a tomb for Jesus' burial - provide shelter to the homeless, food to the hungry, clothing to the naked and comfort to the weary. Like Mary Magdalene -continue to search intently for the risen Lord until you possess Him Who came to die for our sakes and to save us from our sins. You and I have witnessed Him Who rose from the dead, we must proclaim Him to all men and women – "Do not be afraid! Go and tell My brothers (and sisters)..." about the good news and help bring them to the risen Christ Who is ready to heal their sickness and give relief to their pain and suffering.
