Fire: Report by Chief Jim Borden

- Assisted Schuyler Co in mutual aid (fire)
- 501 keeps breaking bolts around pump housing Fire House Apparatus to come and repair
- Mayor Richardson reported the Halloween Party at the fire house was well attended. Cooked 160
 hot dogs, 100 children present along with parents. This year there was a magician who was a big
 hit with everyone.

Water: Wes – busy month

- Repaired leaking valve at the water tower
- Returned Lexair to Ross Valve received correct one

- Repaired operating nut on valve located at corner of Mechanic and Knight
- New and correct pump is installed in the well
