Your HOA at work:



FENCE REPAIRS: In March, the HOA spent approximately \$5k replacing 3k linear feet of fencing.

BARDIN ROAD LANDSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS: In the next few months, work will begin. In Nov 2022, the WOTCHOA board submitted a proposal to the City of Arlington's Neighborhood Matching Grant Program. The grant was officially awarded on Feb 28, 2023. The scope of work includes laying a synthetic fabric across the area between the sidewalk and the interior driveway road, and covering the fabric with rock material. The goal is to improve the landscaping along Bardin Road while controlling the erosion that has troubled this area for years. In 2022 a retaining wall was installed along the interior driveway road to improve the erosion issues along Bardin Rd. The project includes a grant from the city and a required 20% match from WOTCHOA. The grant is funded through the city's General Gas Lease Fund.

) Did You Know? (HOA Rules)

Article IV, Section 4, of the WOTCHOA Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R) prohibits residents from performing new construction on (or modifying the exterior look of) their homes? This includes "without limitation, garages, swimming pools, streets, driveways, sidewalks, drainage facilities, landscaping, fences, walks, fountains, statuary and flagpoles", **as well as** "roofs, walls, patios, sidewalks and driveways; location, style, composition and extent of fencing; roof line and orientation…retaining walls, fountains, flagpoles, statuary, outdoor lighting, or others".

As with all provisions of the CC&R, if you wish to apply for an exception to this restriction, contact the Modifications Committee to submit a request for an exception. The process for this was explained in the February 2023 edition of The Wimbledon Watch WOTC newsletter.

Homeowner Tips (Foundation, Maintenance, Lawn & Garden, Utilities, Recycling, etc.)

Seven Spring Spruce-Ups for your Home:

1. KEEP MOSQUITOS AT BAY. Having warmer weather and longer days means we're entering mosquito season. Take preventative measures by regularly checking your property for standing water and emptying it. Any open containers (empty flowerpots and saucers, or a wheelbarrow) can become mosquito breeding grounds when filled with rainwater, so store items like these upside down or in a shed.

2. INSPECT PATHS AND DRIVEWAY. Repeated freezing and thawing can take a toll on asphalt and concrete. Check your driveway and paths for cracks, scheduling repairs as needed.

3. SCHEDULE COOLING-SYSTEM MAINTENANCE. If you have central air conditioning, be sure to schedule professional maintenance before the start of summer. A properly maintained system cools better, uses less energy, and lasts longer.

4. TEST SPRINKLERS AND IRRIGATION SYSTEM. Don't let the first sign of a malfunctioning system be a drooping garden! Take the time this month to test each part, adjusting or repairing as needed.

5. CLEAN GUTTERS AND DOWNSPOUTS. Having your home's gutters and downspouts cleaned (and repaired, if necessary) is one of the first important tasks to schedule this season. Clogged gutters during a rainy spring can cause water to pool, potentially damaging the roof and siding. 6. KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR TERMITES. From now until May or June, be on the lookout for these winged insects. "Termites swarm in the Spring," says Victor Sedinger, certified home inspector and owner of House Exam Inspection and Consulting. "If there's a bunch of winged insects flying out of a hole in the woodwork, that's probably termites." If you notice any, call a licensed professional pest control company.

7. SPRUCE UP THE FRONT PORCH. Clean the porch floor, exterior windows, windowsills, and front door. Wipe cobwebs from the ceiling and high corners. Lay down a fresh doormat and plant a pot of flowers. If you have porch furniture, clean it off and wash the cushions. (Source: Houzz.com)



💇 Recipe of the Month (for Spring)

Hummingbird Cake (by Marianne Estes) (Serves 12)

Ingredients: 3 Cups Flour, 2 Cups Sugar, 1 tsp Baking Soda, 1 tsp Cinnamon, 3 Eggs (beaten), 1 ½ Cups Oil, 1 ½ tsp Vanilla, 1 Can (8 oz) Pineapple (crushed), 2 Cups Bananas (mashed, about 3), 1 Cup Walnuts (chopped). FROSTING: 1 Package (8 oz) Cream Cheese, 1 Stick Butter (softened), 1 Lb Powdered Sugar, 1 tsp Vanilla, 1 Cup Pecans (chopped)

Step 1 -Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Step 2 -Grease and flour a 10" tube or Bundt pan.

Step 3 -Stir together the flour, sugar, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon in a large bowl.

Step 4 -In a separate bowl, beat together the eggs, oil, vanilla, pineapple, and banana.

Step 5 -Add to flour mixture and mix well by hand. Stir in pecans.

Step 6 -Pour into the prepared pan and bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Step 7 -Cool on a rack for 15 minutes before removing from pan, then cool completely on rack.

Step 8 - Mix cream cheese and butter together. Beat in the sugar until the mixture _____ is light and fluffy. Add vanilla.

Step 9 - Cut cake into 2 layers.

Step 10 -Fill and frost the cake. Sprinkle with chopped nuts and... SERVE!!!
