Unreal lottery win in NC

A North Carolina woman got the surprise of her life when she purchased a winning lottery ticket just one week after buying her first house. Patricia Simmons, of Greensboro, said she bought a lucky \$30 Millionaire Maker scratch-off ticket in Greensboro, which resulted in a \$1 million win, according to a press release from the North Carolina Education Lottery. Simmons, who works as an in-home aide, said she has "been in shock ever since." Her husband also couldn't believe it when she called him to tell him the news. "He said, 'Tricia you're playing," she told lottery officials. "He wanted to see the ticket." Simmons ended up choosing to receive a lump sum payment of \$600,000, which with taxes amounted to a total of \$427,509 in take-home winnings.



Winning, again

Just call her Lady Luck! An anonymous Newark woman is swimming in cash after winning two six-figure prizes on two separate scratch-off tickets in just two weeks, according to the Delaware Lottery. The 70-yearold player first won \$100,000 on a "\$100K Ultimate Cash Instant Game" ticket she purchased at a Speedy gas station in her town, state lottery officials said in a press release. The following week, the woman went out to Lottery Headquarters in Dover to claim her prize. On her way home, she stopped to buy three "Serious Money' tickets from the N. Dover Tiger Mart. This time, she won \$300,000 on a ticket. "When I scratched the \$300,000 winning 'Serious Money' ticket later in the day, my friend and I just sat there in disbelief," the woman recalled. "It was absolute insanity. I love scratching Instant Game tickets!" she added.

NJ ends vintage chip cashing

Here's a strange blast from the past. The New Jersey Division of Gaming Enforcement issued an "emergency" order recently, ending an old policy of cashing chips from the Playboy Casino in Atlantic City. Playboy opened its property in 1981 but was never approved to run the casino; Elsinore Corp., which owned the Four Queens in Las Vegas at the time, held the license. The Playboy name changed in 1984 to Atlantis after Playboy sold its interest to Elsinore and an \$875,000 fund was set up for redeeming Playboy chips. The terms were that players could cash their chips until all the money ran out, with no expiration date; the fund was managed for nearly forty years by the state Department of the Treasury. The state finally determined that the original players had long since redeemed their chips and those that were still being cashed were inherited or purchased on the secondary market.

Lucky, again

A slot player at the Chumash Casino, roughly 125 miles north of Los Angeles in Santa Ynez, hit a \$520,000 jackpot in May. Tempted again by the largest progressive in the Chumash's history, he returned to see if he might get struck by lightning twice. Sure enough, he nailed the \$1.3 million record breaker. He said that he was "surprised" (yeah, I'd think so) and he'll use the money to pay college tuition for his grandchildren and buy one granddaughter, who turns 16 in September, a new car.

Shakopee, Minn. - Canterbury Park in Shakopee, Minn. will host Bingo every Tuesday evening beginning Sept. 12, adding to an already robust gaming menu that includes 24/7 table games and poker, daily simulcast horse race wagering, paper and electronic pull tabs, Minnesota Lottery scratch and lotto games, dealer-assist electronic blackjack and a live horse racing season each summer. Bingo will begin at 6:30 p.m. Both paper packs and electronic packs will be offered with sales beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Paul Allen, radio voice of the Minnesota Vikings and race announcer at Canterbury Park for 29-seasons, will 'kick off' the start of bingo on Sept. 12 as the celebrity caller for the first games.

Canterbury Park has created a 'Bingo Hall' on the second, mezzanine, level of the three-floor grandstand

with plenty of comfortable seating and great sightlines. The Horseshoe Bar will be open at 5:30 p.m. offering a full bar as well as a menu with various snack and appetizer options available until 8:30 in Classics Grille. Guests may also order from a full menu in Chips Bar and Restaurant located in the Canterbury Casino on main level.

Paper packs are available for \$29 with 10 games and three faces that pay \$150. Electronic packs are \$39 with 10 games and six faces that pay \$150. Two jackpot games will be offered each session as well as a \$1,500 coverall.

Bingo participants must be at least 18 years of age. Bingo packs must be purchased with cash.

Oneida expansion

The Oneida Indian Nation recently unveiled a \$370 million investment plan to transform Turning Stone Resort Casino in Central New York, marking the resort's most extensive expansion to date. Over the course of two years, the project will encompass the creation of a conference center. outdoor event spaces, a new hotel, and more. The endeavor is projected to yield a one-time economic impact of \$616 million, generate 3,600 one-time jobs, and contribute \$22.1 million in state and local tax revenues. The Nation has partnered with architecture and design firm Gensler for the project and will break ground on the project "early next year."

Online Bingo Q&A

Q. Is online Bingo on Facebook legal?

A. According to the National Association of Fundraising Ticket Manufacturers virtual Bingo and pull tabs games conducted on Facebook and Facebook Live are illegal.

Q. Is any online Bingo legal?

A. Laws of the United States can be federal or state statutes. In the case of gambling, which applies to Bingo, the laws are state dependent, or in other words, the laws of the individual state can take precedence over the federal statutes. Online gambling was federally banned in 2006, which initiated the canceling of financial transactions between gambling sites and banks. Due to elements of chance dominating the game of Bingo, it is not legal to play straight cash games. Online operations that are managed by the United States are illegal and are undergrounds sites. U.S. residents should stick with free Bingo game sites that offer prizes.

Although it may be seen as a legal gray area, playing on offshore sites as a U.S. resident is illegal. Offshore sites can be dangerous due to operating out of U.S. jurisdiction. If you lose your winnings or are not offered a fair game, there is a zero percent chance to prosecute or reclaim your winnings. In 2006, United States Congress passed the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act to ban all illegal forms of online gambling. Also, Congress also made an amendment to the Safe Port Act, which deemed all illicit gambling transactions between online sites and player's banks illegal. Banks immediately put a halt to all pending transactions, and some were penalized for continuing illegal business.

Q. If online Bingo is illegal, why do I see Bingo sites advertised all the time?

A. These are either Bingo sites operating outside of the U.S. or free Bingo sites where you can accumulate points that can be redeemed for prizes. Pogo Games and Gamesville are examples of sites that offer online Bingo and offer points and prizes. Bingo Blitz is another popular online Bingo site.

Q. How do I watch out for online Bingo scams?

A. Scammers will always exist, and it is important for every player to be aware of them while playing online. When searching for the right site to play on, the safest decision is to pick the larger sites owned by companies whose name you can Google and find current information on ownership and reviews. Look for sites that have a variety of games, regularly run new promotions, have an active social media presence, and access to customer support.

If a site is offering massive amounts of prize money, it could be a scam. Though cash valued prizes are a real thing in free Bingo games, if it sounds way too good to be true, it most likely is. Never give out any financial or personal information such as credit card numbers, passwords or secret question answers in unsecure areas of a site, or to other players in the chat. Scammers can claim to work for the site or the prize commission and try and trick you into a scam.





Stolen valor, still

Right now in the U.S. Congress is bill S.1469 - Stop Stolen Valor for Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Contractors. Its purpose is to require certification of small businesses applying for contracts. Ideally, this bill, if passed, would put more teeth into any punishment handed out for abusing the Department of Veterans Affairs small business and service-disabled veterans contract program.

Despite the laws about stolen valor, crooks still try to claim what isn't rightfully theirs.

In a recent case, a woman was sentenced to federal prison for forging military discharge papers and claiming to have received military medals

after being hit by IEDs. The woman actually worked at the VA and saw firsthand what kind of paperwork and information was required. She ended up grabbing \$250,000 from veterans charities, served as a VFW post commander and gave speeches wearing uniform and medals she purchased online. She managed to keep up the fraud for five years. She'll be heading off to prison for six years and will need to repay \$284,000.

Then there's the guy who's been charged with violating the Stolen Valor Act by falsifying his discharge papers to indicate that he earned many medals and ribbons, including the Purple Heart. The guy did serve in the U.S. military, but he was bounced with a bad-conduct discharge and never earned a Purple Heart. He's incurred the wrath of several government agencies including Homeland Security, DMV, Border Patrol and the U.S. Air Force.

If you suspect someone isn't who they say they are, check online databases. Look at the P.O.W. Network (www.pownetwork.org), the Congressional Medal of Honor Society (www. cmohs.org) and Home of Heroes (www.homeofheroes.com) with an alphabetical index of 120,000 actual recipients.

Q: I just watched an older movie about a military dog, called Max. How can I adopt a dog like that? — T.T. via email

A: Adopting a former military working dog takes a fair amount of research on your part, and the ability to care for dogs that have high energy and need plenty of attention and continuing training. All military dog adoptions are handled through the DOD Military Working Dog Adoption Program at Lackland AFB in Texas.

Dogs eligible for adoption were retired due to age, injury or sickness. Not all dogs saw combat. Some worked in national security, while others were trained as working dogs but did not meet the standards for military service.

Be prepared for a long wait after submitting the application – up to a year or more. First priority for adoption goes to law-enforcement agencies, if the dog is still fit for duty. If not, the dog's handler can adopt it. Only after that do dogs become available for adoption to civilians. Some dogs, sadly, are not adoptable due to temperament or severe injuries. Be aware that you don't have control over what type of dog is made available; although you can state your preference on the application. Be prepared for some pre-adoption expenses as well: If selected to adopt a MWD, you'll need to travel to where the dog is being kept at least twice - once to be interviewed and meet the dog, and again to pick it up if your application is approved.

Grumpy old men

Dear Guy.

We're running into a bit of trouble with our Bingo volunteers, most of whom are men and most of who are of retirement age. The upshot is that they are a collection of grumpy knowit-alls. Every time we have a meeting and discuss some new idea for our games, the conversation inevitably spins into an argument. We've talked about rearranging tables, changing the menu, wearing matching hats, etc.--and every topic resulted in a heated exchange within the group. Do you have any suggestions on how to get these guys to cooperate. - Flashboard, Georgia, via e-mail

Dear Flashboard,

Although you do not say so directly, I am going to assume you are the Bingo manager or a senior staff member with the organization that sponsors this particular Bingo. Based on that, I can instantly identify what the problem is with this group. The problem is you.

As the person in charge of the Bingo and therefore the volunteers, it is your responsibility to set the ground rules for participant behavior at these meetings. If you do not want to have arguments erupt over every little thing, then you must state this to the group and hold firm when things begin to unravel. If the volunteers refuse to follow your mandate, then you may be forced to reduce their participation to voting on each issue without their input, with the majority vote determining the outcome.

This is basic personnel management. If people are not told the rules they are to follow, they will simply make up their own, leading to chaos when the individuals' rules collide. But I don't have to tell you this. You've already seen this time and time again, firsthand.

Bottom line: Encourage discussion, but only if it is civil and controlled. Set agendas for the meetings to help participants behave properly. Give warnings and reduce input if problems persist. And above all, rule with an iron hand. – Guy



Dear M.I.,

One of the benefits of computerized Bingo is the ability to verify, through serial numbers, that a card was legitimately purchased at a specific game and that when someone gets a Bingo, they are the rightful winner. Before computer verification, there was always the risk of someone cheating by bringing in cards they'd purchased elsewhere, thus depriving a hall of sales revenue and honest players their rightful winnings.

Unfortunately, it sounds like you fell victim to what is supposed to keep the games honest—verifiable serial numbers. Someone either mixed your sheets in with the correct ones or failed to record your serial number. Either way, you ended up embarrassed.

On the upside, I commend you for sticking to your guns, and congratulate you for being able to prove your case. And eventually I hope you will reconsider boycotting that hall. They made an honest mistake, and did pay you your prize money. —*Aunt Bingo*

CHOPPED CHICKEN LIVER

¹/₂ cup vegetable oil2 onions, sliced1 lb. chicken livers, rinsed and drained

2 hard cooked eggs 1 tsp. Salt ¹/₂ tsp. Freshly ground pepper Lettuce Crackers or party rye bread

In a large skillet, heat the oil. Add the onions and sauté for ten minutes, stirring frequently. Remove the onions and set aside. Using the same skillet, (don't wash it), sauté the livers for ten minutes, stirring occasionally. Add a little oil, if necessary. Using an electric blender or food processor, grind the onions, liver and the eggs. Chop in a wooden bowl, if an electric appliance is not available. Add the salt and pepper; continue to blend. Refrigerate before serving. Chopped liver may be served as an appetizer on a bed of lettuce, or with crackers or party bread.



Kings versus kings with \$765,731 on the line!

One of the most popular poker tournaments every year at the annual World Series of Poker (WSOP) is the \$1,000 Seniors Championship, which requires participants be 50+ or old to compete.

For example, the 2023 WSOP edition of the tournament attracted 8,180 entrants and awarded a \$7,280,200 prize pool.

Imagine making it deep in such a tournament with six-figure prizes reserved for those lucky enough to make the final table, including \$765,731 and a coveted gold bracelet for the winner. Each decision has the potential to either win or lose you tens of thousands, if not hundreds of thousands, in real-money equity. Just imagine that amount of pressure.

Given all that, now imagine losing in the most brutal way possible. That is exactly what happened to Gordon Eng earlier this summer with just five players remaining. In Level 37 (400,000/800,000/800,000), Shannon Fahey, the last female player remaining in the tournament, raised to 2.2 million in the cutoff and Eng three-bet all in for 7.7 million from the small blind.

The player in the big blind folded and Fahey called with her KdKh. Surprisingly, Eng had the other two kings with the KcKs. The two would chop the pot 97.83% of the time, while each had a mere 2.17% chance of winning outright, the only way being if the board ran out with at least four of one suit.

If the flop came down one of each suit, that possibility would disappear and the duo would split the pot. Instead, it fell Jh10h2h and Fahey was freerolling, meaning she could no longer lose the pot, would at worst chop, and still had a chance to win it all. On the other hand, Eng was in a bad spot with his best-case scenario being a chop.

Fahey had a 36.36% chance of catching another heart, which she promptly did after the dealer burned and turned the 4h. The meaningless 2d was run out on the river and Eng was eliminated in fifth place for \$205,799. It was a truly brutal way to exit the tournament given everything that was on the line, but as any player who has been around long enough would tell you, "That's poker."

Despite winning that hand, Fahey wound up following him out the door in fourth place for \$269,841. Her downfall came when she got her stack all in preflop holding the Qc9c and was flipping against the 7h7s of Dan Heimiller. A seven on the flop sealed her fate while Heimiller, who won the same event back in 2014, went on to finish in third place for \$356,166.

For those wondering, Lonnie Hallett defeated Poker Hall of Famer Billy Baxter in heads-up play to win the tournament for \$765,731 and the gold bracelet.
