



Welcome to the GlenOak Marching Band!

We're excited to kick off the 2024 marching season with you as a member of the Golden Eagle Marching Band! You will find information about fees, schedule, uniforms, and summer band inside. As you look through this schedule, planning is the most important part of the performance process for next year. Time goes by very quickly and it's vital to look ahead and plan for upcoming events.

To stay informed, we do have a Remind 101 which you can subscribe. Text @24goband to 81010. In addition to Remind 101, our band website is WWW.GOHSBAND.COM and our Twitter is @GlenOak_Band. If you used Remind 101 for band last year, you need to sign up again for 2024-2025.

Grading Policy

Individual band grades are determined by Participation in Rehearsals/Performances and Individual Music Assessments. Grades are put into one of three categories worth the following:
Rehearsals are 20%; Performances are 30%; Performance Assessments are 50%

Attendance Policy:

Attendance at rehearsals and performances (both in school and after school) are mandatory and part of the class. Participating in band is a graded course and your attendance is part of that grade. Along with that, you are also part of a team where your attendance is necessary for the success of the entire group. The rest of the band is counting on you. We reserve the right to remove you from a performance if you have excused/unexcused absences from practices or performances causing you to not be ready for a performance. *Our policy for excusing for rehearsal/performance follows the same guidelines as excusing you from school.*

- All performance absences must be approved (unless emergency) by a director at least 3 weeks before the date of absence.
- Rehearsal absences are a minimum of 2 weeks in advance. The earlier the better! Summer absences are no exception. In the event of an emergency, you can notify Mr. Irwin at 491-3937 (band office) or email irwinc@plainlocal.org. Please report all advance absences on the Google Form at www.gohsband.com.

Student Athletes: It's very important that you copy your athletic schedule, highlight conflicts, and discuss with a director. Participating in band and a sport is very "do-able" as long as you plan. We always equally split time for practices/rehearsals with your respective team. For the most part, our rehearsals and performances do not conflict. However, we must know when you are missing rehearsal and any performances in advance according to the 2-3 week guidelines listed above. The key to making this work is advance communication.

Performance Assessments (aka Music Checks):

All GlenOak Bands are graded performance organizations. Successful performances rely 100% on everyone's ability to learn their music. We assess all students in small groups over each song required for pregame and our halftime shows. Each tested song is worth 10 Points with a passing score being 8/10. We do allow students to retest their music for a higher score within the testing "window." Retesting deadlines are listed on the last page. If a student fails to test an adequate amount of music by the deadlines for each show, he/she will be moved to Alternate Status for the next halftime show.

Late assessments will be reduced by 10% for each day past the due date. Excused absences are exempt from the reduction.

Alternates:

Alternate performers are students not meeting eligibility requirements to perform on the performance field. These may include not testing music, extremely low testing scores, and missing mandatory rehearsals/performances. Every situation is different and approached in that manner. Alternate performers may be asked to fill in open spots on the field if progress is made in the area(s) of deficiency.

Summary of all Band Expenses

Below is a detailed list of all marching band-related expenses and when (approx.) these fees will be due. Should you anticipate needing financial assistance to pay these fees, please contact Mr. Irwin at irwinc@plainlocal.org or 330-491-3937.

1. PLIMPA Marching Band Fee

\$90 for New HS Band Members, \$65 for Returning Band Members, and \$35 for Returning Color Guard.

This fee is due by June 1, 2024 and covers the following marching band expenses for the year. This fee can be paid by check or cash and mailed to: PLIMPA, Po Box 8748, Canton, Ohio 44711 You can also pay by credit card at www.gohsband.com

Fee covers the following:

Uniform cleanings for the entire year; Band camp instructional staff; Band T-Shirt for New Members and Band shorts for New Band Members (included in your \$90 fee)

2. Uniform Accessories

Students purchase uniform accessories during the week of July 15th at their uniform fitting appointment or after designated marching band rehearsals that week. Appointments can be made at www.gohsband.com

New band students will need to purchase the following items:

Band shoes	\$36	[1 pair needed]
Spats for shoes	\$15	[1 pair needed]
Black gloves	\$5/pair	[suggested to purchase 2 pair]
Green baret for tuba players	\$15	

The above items are also available for returning members. Should a returning member need to purchase a new black band shirt (\$10) or green shorts (\$20), you can do this at your uniform fitting. If new shoes need to be ordered, this must be done during the uniform fitting week. Spats and gloves can also be purchased before any marching band performance in the PLIMPA ER (Emergency Repair) room.

Uniforms

Uniform fittings will occur at the high school on the following dates: July 15-17, 2024

You can sign up for an appointment at www.gohsband.com *No student is permitted to take a band uniform for alterations.* Make-up uniform fittings will most likely occur on Tuesday, July 23rd after band practice.

Shoes, spats, and gloves are fitted and sold at the time of uniform fitting (see prices above). All band students will be required to wear the approved black marching shoes provide their own black socks (calf height). All other brands except for shoes purchased through PLIMPA are unacceptable and not considered uniform. Previous band shoes are okay. Returning band members: If you use shoes, spats, and/ or gloves from last year, make sure they look new. We take great pride in our band uniform. Take care of it because it represents all of us. *Replacement uniform cost is \$625.00.*

Instruments & Lockers

All students need working instruments for rehearsal and performances. This includes having reeds, oil, etc. If you are borrowing a school-owned instrument, any damage done to the instrument will be your financial responsibility.

All students will be provided a school locker which you must provide your own combination lock. No Lock=No Locker. Any student using a school-owned instrument is responsible for the instrument. Lockers must be kept clean at all times and sharing lockers is prohibited.

Music

You are responsible for all music received. The GlenOak Marching Band memorizes all music for performances except stand tunes. Required dates for memorization of each song is listed below. There will be daily opportunities to test off music in July and August. This will occur in small groups. Please see deadlines below. *DO NOT WAIT UNTIL PRACTICES START IN JULY TO BEGIN MEMORIZATION!* Both Pregame and Halftime #1 will be performed MEMORIZED by the first football game. You need to purchase a lyre and flip folder to use at all rehearsals.

Retesting can occur anytime starting July 15 through August 8. There will be no retesting of Pregame or Halftime #1 after August 8.

*Students who earned a 10/10 on Pregame (On Eagles & Screaming Eagles, Alma Mater, Warm Up, and Star Spangled Banner) do not have to test those pregame songs in 2024. A list will be posted in the band room.

Majorettes/Color Guard Instrumentalists: Must test "On Eagles/Screaming Eagles" and "Alma Mater." Members must also select 1 song per halftime show to test by the publicized deadlines.

Final Forms

Please make sure you update your contact and medical information in Final Forms.

If you have an Inhaler or EpiPen that must be carried during any band function, you must fill out the attached form and have it signed by your physician.

The Authorization for Nonprescribed Medication form can be used if you would like to permit the teaching staff to administer over-the-counter medications (Tylenol, Advil, etc).

Band Rehearsals

Band rehearsals are mandatory. If you are missing any rehearsals this summer, you need to meet with a director. See *Alternate* information on page 1.

Successful performances begin with successful rehearsals. Attendance at practices and coming prepared is a must to have a great band. All pregame and halftime #1 music will be tested during our July and August rehearsals. Music memorization is not something in which you can be successful by procrastinating. It is essential that your music practicing not end when you leave rehearsal each day. The schedule is designed to provide full band marching and music rehearsal PLUS time for sectional work.

Music must be tested by the deadlines assigned. If you want to be written into Halftime Show #2, test your Pregame music on time. No retesting of Pregame or Halftime 1 will occur after August 8.

We will provide regular water breaks throughout the rehearsal. Please dress for the weather, including the use of sun block! We will be planning some fun activities during the months of July and August. Once we have this schedule completed, we will provide you a schedule! Lastly, we are excited that you are becoming a member of the **2024 Golden Eagle Marching Band!** You are in for an exciting and rewarding experience.

- Student athletes are expected to work out plans for practices and performances when conflicts exist.
