During this Lenten season, as the ice and snow slowly melts and as winter has seemingly dragged on, I have reflected on "the practice of waiting." In our culture, waiting is truly a difficult practice, and also one in which I am unlikely to ever win any awards, or even honorable mentions. And yet more and more, I am beginning to see the value of waiting on the Lord in our ministry together at Brewerton UMC. One of the insights that came out of my recent retreat with the Amish in Berlin, Ohio was that it's okay to name a problem or an issue, and take a while alone or as a community to ponder it, without rushing to propose possible solutions. It is okay, and sometimes even necessary, to allow ourselves to sit with the issue before us, without knowing what we will do. This kind of slow deliberation can allow room for the Holy Spirit to work on our hearts over time, and for the way forward to emerge from this - whereas this opportunity is squashed if we rush to fill the need with possible solutions or answers right away. In this spirit, I commend this prayer of meditation to you, written by Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, on the slow work of God. May we trust in this slow work now, and always.

"Above all, trust in the slow work of God. We are quite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay. We should like to skip the intermediate stages. We are impatient of being on the way to something unknown, something new. And yet it is the law of all progress that it is made by passing through some stages of instability – and that it may take a very long time.

And so I think it is with you; your ideas mature gradually—let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste. Don't try to force them on, as though you could be today what time (that is to say, grace and circumstances acting on your own good will) will make of you tomorrow.

Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be. Give Our Lord the benefit of believing that his hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete."

A Message From Your Editor

I have a birds nest over my door and I love it. As each day goes by, I hear the young birds make their "peeping" noise every time one of the parents come to the nest. Unfortunately, I haven't seen them yet but I hope to one day before they fly away. After it is a sure sign of spring.

I remember years back how the chickens would tend to "nest" at this time. One year we decided to let them have their way. In a short time we found that 4 of our hens were very successful. One had about 8 chicks, another about 6, but our biggest surprise was how two hens had 12 each. Now, sorry to say, we actually weren't all that happy about it. This came just after we had sold most of the farm and the animals. What we had left was a zoo of 9 or 10 chickens (not counting the chicks), 1 goose, 2 ducks, 1dog and about 7 or 8 barn cats. And mom and dad both figured that by fall, less than half would survive and a few would end up in our freezer. Ok, so that's life on the farm. However it wasn't long before we saw the courage of a mother. We would let the animals out each morning and put some crack corn in little piles for each group. 1 for the goose, 1 for the two ducks, and 1 long line for the chickens. I often stood by for a bit to make sure that peace was kept. Shortly, I started to go back to the house when sudden wild commotion started. I turned in time to see a ball of feather and fur and just as quick, I saw a cat go running up behind the barn and the grey speckled mother of 12 running back to her chicks - all 12 still present. As far as I know, that cat never went near the chickens again. I felt that the chicks were in good hands and went about my day.

As it turned out, many of the chicks made it and some ended up in the freezer. But, some didn't, as mom seemed to have adopted a couple called them her chickens. Dad of course didn't argue, he just smiled and went along with it. And I realized later that they were a great comfort to my mother and she looked after them each day. They would even come when she called them. Even when mom could no longer get out much, the chickens would go the front door where the rooster would crow until mom came out to get them off the porch (of course giving them some bread in the process).

I think I understand how mom felt about the "birds" as they can be entertaining. And as we look at the birds and all of God's creatures we can see a little of ourselves. And maybe even learn a little. God Bless & Happy Easter *Kathy Peckham*

Red Bird Mission Opportunity - August 12 thru 20, 2017

The Red Bird Mission, School and Clinics are located in Beverly, Kentucky. This United Methodist Mission Campus has been in operation since 1921 serving a distressed rural area formed from the old coal mining days gone by. Chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing and rugged mountainous terrain provide obstacles to a fuller life for the residents of this area.

Through this one week adventure you have the opportunity to help these folks through your time, your talent, your service and your witness. The main focus of this mission is in the area of community housing improvement however there are a variety of other ways to serve as well. You'll be serving others but you'll come away feeling like you were the one served.

<u>Dates</u>: August 12th to August 20th. Well be leaving Saturday morning the 12th and arrive at Red Bird the next day - Sunday around 4pm. Our work adventure will begin on Monday and end on Friday at noon, with Wednesday as a full day of rest for sightseeing. We'll travel home on Saturday and arrive home on Sunday the 20th. Note that it is possible to get home in one day arriving on Saturday night if necessary.

<u>Transportation</u>: We'll be driving our own cars to Kentucky. We plan to carpool to reduce the expenses and the need for drivers. We will need to pack efficiently. We expect to stay overnight the first night in a host United Methodist church possibly in Ohio or western Pennsylvania. The same plan will work in reverse for our return trip.

<u>Costs and Deposit</u>: The total cost for the trip will be \$500 per person which will cover our room and board for the week as well as transportation costs and the material costs required by the Mission. We'll be working hard over the next few months to raise those funds to reduce the financial burden on everyone. If you are planning to go you will need to pay a deposit of \$50.00 payable to Brewerton UMC - Red Bird Fund no later than April 1st as well as complete the application forms which you can pick up in the Narthex at church or from Tammy or Craig Allen. Luke 24:

Jesus Has Risen

24 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " ⁸ Then they remembered his words.

⁹When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹⁰It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹²Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

Jesus Appears to the Disciples

³⁶ While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

³⁷ They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."
⁴⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. ⁴¹ And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate it in their presence.
⁴⁴ He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of

Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Jesus Teaches Nicodemus

¹ Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. ² He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no

one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him." ³ Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.^[a]"

⁴ "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!"

⁵ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. ⁶ Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit^[b] gives birth to spirit. ⁷ You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You^[c] must be born again.' ⁸ The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."^[d] ⁹ "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.

¹⁰ "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? ¹¹ Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. ¹² I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven – the Son of Man.^{[e] 14} Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up,^{[f] 15} that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."^[g]

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. ¹⁹ This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. ²⁰ Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. ²¹ But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

What's NEW in the Pantry?

Our pantry has once again been blessed. This time the blessing came to us in the form of a check in the amount of \$21,752.62 from the Brewerton Christian Church in late January. The donation was made possible through the sale of the building we fondly called "The Stone Church," located in the center of town, opposite the Brewerton Pharmacy. The congregation were faithful supporters of our food pantry over the years; helping us with Thanksgiving Food Baskets, monthly food donations and several volunteers. We were sorry to see the church close; but the impact they had in our community will live on in the work we continue to do in our pantry. We are thankful to have received such a generous donation and are committed to being good stewards of the funds. Our pantry is a mission that is supported by our congregation and our pantry partners at Divine Mercy and Calvary Baptist churches. Our partnership has enabled us to reach out to those in need and make a difference in the lives of many, week after week, month after month & year after year. It takes a village to make it all happen and we are blessed to have the love and support of so many. We are especially grateful that our church building is home to our pantry; providing an inviting place for our clients to visit. Each pantry day, the Fellowship Room is converted into our Bread & Snack Room and on Thursday afternoons it resembles the farmer's market as we sort produce from our Grocery Rescue shipment. Bottom line...our pantry would not exist without our building. In the spirit of appreciation for the congregation of BUMC's "opening its hearts and its doors" to those in need, we stand ready to help support our building by allocating approximately 40% of the funds (\$9,000) to a special Pantry Fund earmarked for maintenance to be used to help support building repairs as identified by the Trustees. The remaining funds (\$12,000) will be invested and secured for future needs. We are committed to working

with our Trustees to help them maintain the safety and well being of the building that is home to our Pantry.

Through the generous support of our partner churches & community, our Food Pantry maintains a healthy fund balance that allows us to keep our shelves well-stocked. Our partnership with the Food Bank of CNY also allows us to purchase food items at a discounted rate; with much of it covered by HPNAP Food Grant. In addition to operational grants, our pantry has also benefited from several Capital Equipment grants over the years and has allowed us to purchase shelving units, utility carts and appliances. We are preparing our 2017/2018 Grant Application now and will be requesting Food Bank funds to purchase a new freezer, utility carts and a hand truck to replace equipment that has seen its better days! Thank you for allowing our pantry to grow over the years; to become what we are today. We look forward to our future together. And together we are making a difference in the lives of many.
