Living and LIFE-GIVING Bread

CORPUS CHRISTI - EUCHARIST - BREAD OF LIFE

"The Body of Christ"... "The Blood of Christ"... these are absolutely amazing words we hear each time we receive the Eucharist. The truth proclaimed by the minister of the Eucharist - that this is "the Body of Christ", "the Blood of Christ" - is a familiar teaching, but what exactly do these words mean?

We are not cannibals as some believed early Christians were. We receive something that looks and tastes like bread, or a wafer and wine, but this is no longer ordinary bread or ordinary wine. These elements have become for us the Body and Blood of Christ, the Risen Lord. We have prayed 'God take our gifts, our bread and wine, and change them, utterly transform them'. God answers our prayer and transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. This we traditionally term the 'Real Presence', a great gift to Christians.

MYSTERY OF FAITH

ur response to this gift is the word 'Amen'. It simply means 'I believe', 'I agree' I assent'. Yes, I believe in the presence of Jesus the Christ, the Risen Lord, in the consecrated elements of bread and wine. This bread and wine are no longer ordinary bread and wine, they have been changed at their deepest level, in their meaning. They have become for us food for eternal life.

To partake in Holy Communion, to eat the bread and drink the wine, is no small act for a Christian. It is a concrete statement of who we are, and who we are to become. This little word 'Amen' is the deepest prayer we can offer.

In one of his most famous homilies, St Augustine, that famous bishop from fifth century North Africa, taught what an amazing thing it is to be able to receive Holy Communion. "It is," he told his congregation, "your own mystery that you are receiving! You are saying 'Amen' to what you are: your response is a personal signature, affirming your faith. When you hear 'The body of Christ', you reply 'Amen.'"

WE ARE THE BODY OF CHRIST


t is your own mystery that you are receiving."

These are quite amazing words. What he means is
that I already am the Body of Christ, we, this

gathering of Christians, are the Body of Christ. This is a profound statement. I am part of the Body of Christ. We, the people gathered to celebrate Mass are the Body of Christ, and we will soon receive the Body of Christ into our very being. By doing so we are slowly becoming even more the Body of Christ. By saying 'Amen' we are stating that this is what we believe, what we want to believe, and because of all this we desire to live differently.

Augustine's next words are even more challenging. Not alone are we to really to believe that we are receiving the Body of Christ but we are to 'Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your 'Amen' may ring true!' This challenge, "to let our 'Amen' ring true," to resound throughout the world, reminds us that this is no pious exercise. Receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is something to be taken very seriously.

To be a Christian is to have a Eucharistic vocation. To celebrate the Eucharist is a call to transformation, to truly be Christ's body in the world. It is to allow what we do on Sundays to influence that which we do every other day. The Eucharist is a call to live as Jesus lived. The Eucharist empowers us so that we can try to live more justly, more kindly, more courageously. This is what Jesus meant when he said to 'do this in memory of me'. This is what we assent to each time we say 'Amen' to the minister's proclamation 'The Body of Christ', 'The Blood of Christ'.
