

The State of the Church Address

It has been QUITE a year! 2016 began with a time of prayer and fasting that culminated in the 24-Hour Prayer Vigil. That Sunday, we celebrated Commitment Sunday- the day we had the opportunity to make our financial pledge for the year. Confirmation class started in February with 11 young people!

The Easter season started with our Fat Tuesday on Ash Wednesday pancake dinner followed by the Ash Wednesday worship service. Then, on March 13, we celebrated Confirmation Sunday, baptizing 9 and bringing 11 into membership. Easter was celebrated on Sunday, March 27. Between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, nearly 900 folks worshiped with us! As the first quarter came to a close, we had performed 12 baptisms and brought in 16 new members!

April started with a huge event and a crushing loss. On the morning of The Journey- a massive success- we found out that our beloved organist, Pat Olson, had passed away. And while many tears were shed that morning, everyone "soldiered up" and made The Journey the amazing event that it was. The rest of the second quarter saw the Survivor's Dinner, the Relay For Life event, among other things. Rhubarb Fest broke every record we had regarding number of meals served, number of pies sold and amount of money raised. At the close of June, we were up to 26 new members and 14 baptisms.

The third quarter saw the launch of one of the most ambitious things a church can do- a third Sunday morning worship service. But before that, we had a building full of people as we held Vacation Bible School! The rest of the summer was dedicated to preparing for the new worship service. But on Wednesday, August 17, we welcoming Father Dominic- the Bread Monk. He shared a wonderful evening with us. Then, on August 21, we experienced the Soft Launch of that service! 111 people gathered that first Sunday! On 9/11, the official Hard Launch of that new service happened. 5 more new members and another baptism were added.

The fourth quarter has seen more amazing things. Wednesday Night Fellowship growing and strengthening. A record-breaking Trunk or Treat. A record-breaking Operation Christmas Child Shoebox collection. An incredible Follow the Star Holiday Bazaar. As of this writing, with December still to go, we have brought in 36 new members and performed 15 baptisms. More than 50% of the United Methodist churches in this country will bring in NO new members this year! We will end the year with a weekly average worship attendance of about 275 and a weekly average Christian Education attendance of 125. Both of those numbers are AMAZING! (continued on page 2)

This was just a partial list of all the things we did this year. I could fill this entire newsletter with the ministries this church offered this year. We are doing more and more things that connect people to Jesus Christ. And that means that more and more people are stepping up in powerful ways to help make that happen. Thank you for that!

The truth is that, as a church grows, one of two things will happen: they will either continue to adjust to handle the growth or they will contract back to what they can handle. I have experienced both realities in my 20 years of ministry and I simply don't have a gear for a church to pull back from doing God's work.

That means we have some stretching to do. The 2017 budget features a 9.98% increase over 2016. That is a bold budget. And one of the reasons for that increase is the approval by the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee, the Finance Committee and the Administrative Council to hire a 20 hour/week Associate Pastor in the new year. The truth is that, according to a time study that was done this year, your church staff is absolutely working at full capacity. The only way to proactively keep up with the growth is to add more staff to help shoulder the load. And additional staff means a greater commitment to supporting the finances of the church.

I invite you to pray about this process. We will soon begin the task of accepting resumes, interviewing potential candidates and doing a LOT of praying! Finding the RIGHT person is far more important than filling the position. We stand on the threshold of even more amazing things. And I, for one, can't WAIT to see what God has in store for us! It is truly an honor to be your pastor!

(Numbers 24:17a, Micah 5:2)

Saturday, December 24, 2016- When You Wish Upon a Star (Luke 2:6-20)

Recognizing the extraordinary in the midst of the ordinary helps create a powerful sense of hope. (Isaiah 9:6-7)

Sunday, December 25, 2016- You've Got a Friend in Me (John 1:1-14)

Following Emmanuel- God with us- is the best form of guidance.

Bring the kids. Bring the grandkids. Bring the neighbors. Pull up a chair. Grab a seat on the couch. Get ready for everything old to be new again this Christmas!



BUDGET NARRATIVE FOR 2017

Here is an overview of the church budget for 2017. We want to thank each of you who make the ministries of our church possible through your commitments and contributions. Hopefully, this narrative will help each of us to see how our gifts are used and what a difference they make.

Each year our church budget is based on the careful recommendation of each church committee. Each is "ministry-based," estimating the actual cost of performing the ministries and missions entrusted to them.

Based on our best planning, the Finance and Stewardship Committee, believe that for 2017 we will need \$347,811 to support the missions and ministries of the Aledo United Methodist Church. This is an increase of approximately \$31,000 over last year's budget and a 10% increase. Of course, this will only happen if we can anticipate a ten percent increase in ministry income!

The Pastor-Parish Relations Committee recommended a 2% increase in salaries for current staff and 5% for Rev. Mark's health insurance also increased \$1,200.00 for next year. After much discussion the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee also recommended that our church include in our 2017 budget an allocation of \$15,600 for an Associate Pastor. Recommendations from the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee represent \$22,322 of the \$31,000 increase.

Conference obligations increased \$1,464 for 2017. Other increases include \$500 for youth ministries, \$1,000 for building and liability insurance, \$500 for office supplies, \$1,000 for Sunday School materials and books and \$1,000 for Wed. Night Fellowship and kitchen supplies. Our 2017 budget was approved by the Administrative Board and Charge Conference in October.

This increase of 10% in our budget for next year is a challenge that the Finance and Stewardship Committee feels comfortable recommending to our congregation. It will require sacrificial giving not only by those presently supporting the ministries of our church, but also by those who have not yet shared in this collective responsibility up to now.

Operation Christmas Child 2016 Thank You

Just after unloading and bringing all of this year's Operation Christmas Child boxes into the collection facility, our group of volunteers joined hands and prayed over them. Spoken words of praise and thanksgiving were offered up to God along with a plea that these boxes find the children who need them most. As I stood there with the group and offered up my own prayers, I could not ignore the warmth I felt inside knowing that, in some small way, I was part of a loving congregation who came together in yet another way to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ. Although I shouldn't be, I am always amazed at the love and generosity that is shown for this mission.

Some may liken Operation Christmas Child to putting a letter in a bottle and casting it in the ocean since we have absolutely no way of knowing where these boxes will land. We don't know which child will have their life changed by the knowledge that they are loved. We don't know what family will come to know Jesus Christ because of a small shoebox gift. Finally, we don't know where these boxes will cause a congregation to grow or a new church to generate. You know what...we really don't need to know. Our job is to show the love of Jesus Christ to others..... and let Him take it from there. I can't think of a better place to put our trust.

This is not Joan's mission, it's not Reverend Mark's mission, and it's certainly not my mission. It's not even an Aledo United Methodist mission. 


C.I.A. (Caring Individual Adults) Luncheon Update by Joanne Harris
