
## **Delta Cross Channel Gate Upgrades Project**

September 2020

## Background

As part of the Central Valley Project (CVP), the Bureau of Reclamation operates the Delta Cross Channel to manage water quality throughout the central part of the Delta and at the Federal and State pumping facilities. Located near Walnut Grove, the facility has two radial gates that when open, provide up to 3,500 cubic feet per second from the Sacramento River into the Lower Mokelumne River which flows into the central part of the Delta and to the pump facilities of the State Water Project (SWP) and CVP.

Reclamation recently initiated the Delta Cross Channel Gate Upgrades Project (Project), which will evaluate alternatives to:



- Provide for remote and more frequent operations of the gates consistent with the October 2019 Proposed Action on the Coordinated Long-Term Operation of the Central Valley Project and State Water Project and State Water Resources Control Board Decision D-1641
- Improve safety at the site, including boater safety
- Increase operational life of facility and reduce ongoing operations and maintenance costs

## **Public and Stakeholder Engagement**

Reclamation intends to engage the public and stakeholders during the planning and implementation of the Project.
