

'... thanks for the list of deceased. I have about ten of those folks that I knew and two were in my senior Printing Class. Ron Littleton and Dean Rank and both were close personal friends. I do not know the location of any of those on that list you mailed to me that are still "missing". Sorry I can't help.

Ron died within 4 yrs of graduation yet too early for Viet Nam. I went there in 66 and 67. Barely got back myself. Do you know about Mr. Walter Knox, my Printing Teacher and Homeroom Teacher? He was the best teacher I ever had in my entire life. He was a great man. Taught me everything I knew about being a Lithographer. But, I could not get that libe of work in the US Navy. They told me it was a very small amount of people in that rating and it was fill when I joined. A few years later, one of my cousins got into the Navy and he got into that rating where I could not before. I had to go into medicine and finally became a Pharmacist. All compliments of the US Navy. I still remember every work of our old HHS School Song. Do you? I will never forget singing it in the assemblies we had at HHS. Was so proud to be in Mr. Knox's class and homeroom. He was a great guy...

Thanks again for your fine help in this matter. May all our class again be reunited someday in Heaven. We had some good folks. I wish I had known more of them.
