

PGK MICHAEL E. ANTONUCCI 6/16/1930 — 12/21/2018



Mike Antonucci joined the order in June 1961. He advanced in his degrees and received his 4th degree in October 1973. He was active in the council and became the 10th Grand Knight of the council in 1976 when the council chambers were located at 890 Hicksville Road. He instituted the first Mass for Sick and Deceased Members of the Council.

When it became apparent that the existing council chambers were inadequate. Mike contributed to the study to find a bigger home for the council and as Grand Knight he approved a sum of \$200,000 to purchase a new council home at 20 Hicksville Road.

After his term as Grand Knight he served as a Dis-

trict Deputy in the Nassau/Suffolk Board of District Deputies, and he served as Secretary to the Chairman of the Nassau/Suffolk Chapter.

Mike assumed the position of President of the 5983 Corporation in 1985. After 20 years of operation at 20 Hicksville Road it was determined that the expense of operating that large building was more than we could afford. Mike was instrumental in the planning and sale of the building at 20 Hicksville Road in 1999.

Soon after the sale of the building, a committee was formed to search for another more-affordable building for the council. When the site at 110 Merritts Road was found, Mike was instrumental in laying out the renovations needed to transform a florist warehouse into the comfortable council chambers that we now enjoy.

After the renovation was complete. Mike stayed on as Corporation President until the building operation was stabilized. After retiring from the presidency position, Mike took over as LOTTO Chairman and kept that fundraiser successful.

Those who worked with Mike In the old days remember that he would keep track of important information by writing it on an index card. He would always carry the cards in his shirt pocket. Whenever important council matters were discussed he often referred to those index cards.

Mike's common sense, experience and intelligence made his contributions to council activities especially valuable. He freely provided knowledgeable advice to all who asked. Mike was selected as Knight of the Year in 1999. He stayed active in council activities right up to his recent passing.

May the soul of PGK Mike Antonucci rest in peace.





SAINTS OF THE SEASON

St. Patrick was a man of action. From "The Breast-plate of St. Patrick": "Christ shield me this day: Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I arise, Christ in the heart of every person who thinks of me, Christ in the eye that sees me, Christ in the ear that hears me."

The Bible tells us nothing of <u>St. Joseph</u> in the years after the return to Nazareth except the incident of finding Jesus in the Temple. St. Bernardine of Siena tells us "He was chosen by the Eternal Father as the trustworthy guardian and protector of His greatest treasures. He carried out his vocation with complete fidelity until at last God called him, saying: 'Good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord' "

In April, we celebrate the pope whose job was to implement the historic Council of Trent:

Pope Pius V (1504-1572)

He ordered the founding of seminaries for the proper training of priests. He published a new missal, a new breviary, a new catechism and established the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine classes for the young. Some fondly remember the Tridentine Mass, so named "Tridentine" derived from the Latin Tridentinus, "related to the city of Tridentum" (modern-day Trent, Italy), where the Council of Trent was held. Further, In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI issued the motu proprio Summorum Pontificum, accompanied by a letter to the world's bishops, authorizing use of the 1962 Tridentine Mass by all Latin Rite Catholic priests in Masses celebrated.

Significantly, he organized the fleet that won a decisive victory against the Islamists in the Gulf of Leponto, off Greece, on October 1571. This victory ended the Ottoman threat to Christianity in the Mediterranean.


