We have several quilts left to give in 2017 to Wounded Warriors in Racine & Milwaukee, Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, Children's Hospital and several wherever needed.

The estimated total of 214 quilts is close to \$80,250.00!!! This total includes fabric used and time served!

The needs for 2017 are as yet unknown. Keep making quilts. There will always be a need to cover someone with the amazing hug of a quilt. Please keep the size of your quilts between 45  $\times$  50 to 65  $\times$  80 inches. Most of the places do not have queen size beds! If you need fabric, FREE kits are available for the asking. #### CRAYON CHALLENGE FOR LIGHT-HOUSE LEGACIES 2017

Yes, Lighthouse members will again be able to choose a small baggie at our **February 27** meeting with a crayon hidden inside the rules. You make a little 12 inch square quilt and the main color is the color of your crayon! Deadline is at our **July 31** meeting or SOONER!

There are only 40 crayons so come early and find Barbara Vallone at the Membership Table where you'll be able to read the rules and more before you choose a baggie ~ this year there will be NO brown, black, gray, or white crayons!!

Proceeds will again go to All Saints Foundation for the Mental Health and Addiction Program at the Wisconsin Avenue site. This is the ONLY inpatient care center in Racine and Kenosha serving about 6,500 patients a year. Plus, this program is one of the few in the state that accepts Medicaid.


