On the last day of General Conference, the end of the two-week event that included one week of

legislative committees and one week of plenary sessions, Bishop Sue provided a wrap-up of this General Conference session and what she hopes the Virginia Conference focuses on moving forward.

Bishop Sue talked about the love, acceptance, joy, and the embracing of one another rather than what she called the awful division, argument and ugliness that marked the last several General Conference sessions.

"I don't know about you but that's the Church I want to be part of," she said. "Where not everybody agrees – there were traditionalists here, progressives here, I would say most people here are centrists – but we really decided it was more important to love each other and get along and we had enough of the arguing. So we put that behind us and a lot of very positive stuff came out of these last two weeks."

Bishop Sue, said she would emphasize in local churches that "The United Methodist Church is focused on mission and the love of Jesus Christ and the living out of the Gospel in sacrificial love and outpouring of mission." She celebrated the sacramental authority granted to ordained deacons and the regionalization work.

"It's a new day for really living out the Gospel, for really showing and behaving as Jesus did and moving into our communities as forces of love and grace and becoming islands of sanity in our crazy world," she said.



Did You Know ...?

Philip Paul Bliss was "an American composer, conductor, writer of hymns, and bass-baritone Gospel singer" (<u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/</u> <u>Philip_Bliss</u>). Born July 9, 1838, in PA and died on Dec. 29, 1876, in OH from a train wreck and fire at the young age of 38, *along with his wife*, Philip P. Bliss is considered "the second most famous Christian song writer in history. Had he lived as long

as his peers--Fanny Crosby, Charles Wesley, and Ira Sankey, he may have surpassed them all as the greatest song writer of all time"

(https://www.wholesomewords.org/biography/biobliss.html). In his short life, he wrote more than 300 songs that were published and sung widely! Among his most well-known hymns are these favorites: "Almost Persuaded," "Dare to Be a Daniel," "Hallelujah 'Tis Done!," "Hallelujah, What a Savior!," "Jesus Loves Even Me," "Let the Lower Lights Be Burning," "The Light of the World Is Jesus," "Whosoever Will, and "Wonderful Words of Life." To add, he wrote the music for "It Is Well with My Soul," "I Gave My Life for Thee," and "Precious Promise," but he wrote the lyrics for "My Redeemer" (www.wholesomewords.org/biography/bliss). 
