ARIZONA LEGALIZES SPORTS BETTING

Both houses of the Arizona Legislature passed bills that legalize sports betting in the Grand Canyon State this April. Governor Doug Ducey signed the joint bill the legislature sent to him. Arizona becomes the 21st state, along with the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, with legal sports betting. The state's professional sports teams (Diamondbacks, Suns, Cardinals, and Coyotes) will all have licenses to operate on-site sports betting at their arenas and stadiums. So will the Phoenix Open and NASCAR. Since sports betting will be available at tribal casinos (the law allows up to 10 Indian tribes to offer it), the Bureau of Indian Affairs needs to sign off on the bill, but that formality could take as little as 90 days. Ducey also signed a new gambling compact between the state and the tribal nations.

WYOMING ALSO ONBOARD

The governor of Wyoming has signed a bill that will make sports betting legal in the state as of September 1. Wagering will be allowed online only, in a format similar to that in Tennessee. There will be a 10% tax on the win.

SEVEN BUFFETS REOPEN

Hungry visitors to the Mississippi Gulf Coast will be happy to know seven of the twelve buffets at Mississippi Gulf Coast casinos operating before the pandemic shutdown were reopened as of press time: Beau Rivage, Golden Nugget, Hollywood, Palace, Island View, Silver Slipper, and Treasure Bay. The procedures range from self-service in the usual fashion and staff dishing out the food at serving stations to wait service and AYCE combined with a regular menu.

Spring Brings Big Bucks

Bingo player Aurelio Aguilar hit the Jumbo Progressive on the 52nd number while playing at Red Rock Casino's Bingo room, netting him \$207,691—making his Easter weekend that followed just that much more festive. Station Casinos' linked Jumbo Progressive starts at \$100,000, with 47 or fewer called numbers needed to win. The number of balls needed to win the Jackpot depends on the posted jackpot amount, and the game plays as an odd ball coverall. Once the jumbo hits, all participating properties go into a "bonus session" which will pay \$1,000 on all regular games, no matter what level card is being played.

Millenials Turn to Bingo

Over the past decade Bingo demographics have changed with the addition of Millennials, who took to the game as it made a transition to the online environment. Millennials had the unique experience of growing up playing video games and witnessed the technical advancements firsthand. This generation's love of electronic games is still going strong and some players have branched out to other genres. While millennials are not keen on spending too much time and resources gambling, they do fancy a brief and exciting session. Millennials have the technical skills needed to understand and trust the technology behind online games. And contrary to some older people's belief that Millennials are anti-social, they are simply more comfortable having social interactions through smart devices. In online Bingo, players can chat to each other while they play and meet new people.

Feds After Florida Fraudsters

åA Florida couple who swindled nearly \$6 million from charities through an illegal Bingo operation asked an 11th Circuit panel in Atlanta recently to reject the government's appeal seeking to

reverse their acquittal on charges of conspiracy to commit wire fraud. An attorney for former spouses Larry and Dixie Masino told a three-judge panel of the Atlanta-based appeals court that the government failed to prove during an eight-day trial that the couple ever had any intent to defraud the charities. The Masinos rented a Bingo hall in northwest Florida to local charities and ran Bingo games for them in exchange for a large portion of the proceeds. The operation continued for over two decades before they were convicted of illegal gambling and money laundering in 2018. Rather than turning over all Bingo proceeds to players in the form of prizes as Florida law requires, the Masinos held onto millions for themselves. Between 2006 and 2015, the couple received and laundered \$5.8 million in profits. Larry Masino was sentenced to one year in prison and Dixie received four months of house arrest as part of a five-year probation term. The couple was also ordered to pay a forfeiture judgment of \$5.8 million. Assistant U.S. Attorney Alicia Forbes said the evidence definitively showed the Masinos "conspired and intended to defraud the charities," arguing that the couple actively harmed the charities by keeping excess Bingo proceeds. The panel did not indicate when it would reach a decision in the case.

Could You Have Prediabetes?

Americans today have prediabetes. Left untreated, it almost always turns into type 2 diabetes within 10 years. And, if you have prediabetes, the long-term damage it can cause—especially to your heart and circulatory system—may already be starting.

But the good news is that prediabetes doesn't mean that you're destined for full-blown diabetes. Prediabetes can actually be reversed, and diabetes prevented, by making some simple lifestyle changes like losing weight, exercising, eating a healthy diet and cutting back on carbohydrates. Or, if you need more help, oral medications may also be an option. <u>bmi</u> to calculate your BMI.

If you are younger than 45 but are overweight, or have high blood pressure, a family history of diabetes, or belong to an ethnic group (Latino, Asian, African or Native American) at high risk for diabetes, you should get checked too.

To help you determine

plans and Medicare cover diabetes tests, however, if you're reluctant to visit your doctor to get tested, an alternative is to go to the drug store, buy a blood glucose meter and test yourself at home. They cost around \$20.

If you find that you are prediabetic or diabetic, you need to see your doctor to develop a plan to get it under control. The ADA recommends losing weight and doing moderate exercise, such as 150 minutes a week of brisk walking. And when lifestyle changes alone don't work, medication might. The ADA recommends the generic drug metformin, especially for very overweight people younger than 60. For more information on diabetes and prediabetes or to find help, join a lifestyle change program recognized by the CDC (see <u>CDC.gov/diabetes/prevention</u>). These programs offer in-person and online classes in more than 1,500 locations throughout the U.S. Over the course of a year, a coach will help you eat healthy, increase your physical activity and develop new habits.

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about prediabetes, and how can you know if you have it? My 62-yearold husband, who's in pretty good shape, was recently diagnosed with prediabetes and didn't have clue. Could I have it too? — **Wondering Spouse**

Dear Wondering,

Underlying today's growing epidemic of type 2 diabetes is a much larger epidemic called prediabetes, which is when the blood sugar levels are higher than they should be but not high enough to be called diabetes.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that as many as 84 million

Get Tested

Because prediabetes typically causes no outward symptoms, most people that have it don't realize it. The only way to know for sure if you have it is to get a blood test.

Everyone age 45 years or older should consider getting tested for prediabetes, especially if you are overweight with a body mass index (BMI) above 25. See <u>CDC.gov/</u> your risk of diabetes, the American Diabetes Association (ADA) has a quick, online risk test you can take for free at <u>DoIHavePrediabetes.org</u>.

Diabetes Tests

If you find that you're at risk for prediabetes, there are three different tests your doctor can give you to diagnosis it. The most common is the "fasting plasma glucose test," which requires an eight-hour fast before you take it. There's also the "oral glucose tolerance test" to see how your body processes sugar, and the "hemoglobin A1C test" that measures your average blood sugar over the past three months. It can be taken anytime regardless of when you ate.

Hi Guy,

I see that they call smaller Bingos "Charity Bingos." What does that mean, exactly? The money players spend is donated to charity? Do you know what these charities are and how they are picked? — Jerome, via email

Hi Jerome,

Put simply, charity Bingos operate in order to generate funds for charitable work. Some charities have their own licenses and offer their own games. Others are part of a "pool" of charities that may receive a portion of Bingo winnings from a particular organization. For example, a Knights of Columbus Bingo will direct some of the funds to KofC activities and the rest is shared among other not-for-profits the Knights have chosen to help.

I do not know the specific process an organization goes through to select the charities it will support, but I assume there is some kind of selection committee that makes that decision. **— Guy**

Dear Guy,

The Bingo where I attend is frequented by several groups of teenage boys. They occasionally get a bit loud, but otherwise are not a problem. But I have to be honest, I am not sure how I feel about such young guys playing Bingo. Casinos keep underage players out. They can get big fines if they are caught letting underage players play. Yet here in a community Bingo hall it seems to be OK. — **Brendan B., Michigan**

Dear Brendan,

I see your point, Bingo is gambling, and perhaps youngsters should not be exposed to it. Some folks say no one under 18 should be allowed into a Bingo hall, regardless of how low the stakes are. Others say they would rather see teens enjoying a quiet evening of Bingo than running around bored and getting into trouble.



Paws Corner

Q: We have a fenced backyard and have no problem letting our dog "Ace" out to roam. However, for the first time, Ace ran into a skunk! Now I'm trying to get rid of that horrible skunk odor. What can I use to clean his fur? And how do I keep skunks off my property? — **Suzie H., via email**



A: Skunk encounters are pretty awful. And when a dog gets a good soaking from the skunk's defensive spray, it can be tough to get out of its hair. The American Kennel Club's website (<u>www.akc.</u> <u>org</u>) has some expert advice on getting rid of the skunk smell on dogs. Rule No. 1: Do not bring the dog in the house if you can avoid it.

They recommend a homemade solution to break up and remove the odiferous oil that makes up skunk spray: Mix a quart of 3% hydrogen peroxide (available over the counter at the local pharmacy) with two teaspoons of mild dish soap and a quarter cup of baking soda. This mixture will start foaming immediately, so have Ace ready. Rub the foamy solution into his coat, soaking it completely. (Avoiding his eyes or ears.) Leave it on for five minutes, then rinse. Discard any unused solution. To keep the skunk from coming back, determine where it's getting into your yard and when. Open trash cans or compost piles are attractive foraging spots. Skunks are most active after sundown or in the early morning hours. Ace may be fine in the yard during the day, but you should accompany him on potty breaks before sunrise or after sundown to prevent another stinky encounter.



Nevada On the Rebound

The Nevada gambling win statewide broke the \$1 billion mark in March for the first time in 13 months; the last time it did so was February 2020 before the shutdown of all casinos for 78 days. The total win was \$1.07 billion, a 73% increase from March 2020. Of course, that's not an apples-to-apples comparison, since the casinos closed in the middle of the month last year. But the billion-dollar win is solid evidence of how much demand had been pent up during the closures and subsequent capacity restrictions; the casino occupancy limit was raised from 25% to 50% of total capacity on March 15. In addition, March Madness and stimulus money drove visitation and revenue. In fact, five jurisdictions set alltime gambling-revenue records in March: downtown Las Vegas, the Boulder Strip, and Clark County along with Elko County in eastern Nevada and Carson Valley in the north.

MEGA HIT

This past Spring, an early morning visitor from New Mexico hit the largest Megabucks jackpot since Christmas Eve for \$10.5 million at South Point. It followed right on the heels of a \$2.1 million jackpot hit on a Monopoly Millionaire machine at the Cosmopolitan by a visitor from Alaska (\$4 bet of a reported \$40 buy-in). Another Alaska resident hit it big in Vegas at the Suncoast on Christmas Eve-interestingly, that player also bought in for \$40.

TRIP TO MARS?

It looks like Bruno Mars will be the first headliner to relaunch Strip residencies when he appears at the Park Theater at Park MGM over the July Fourth weekend. She now knows where the kitchen is and that I've laid in a supply of her favorite foods. She heads there, leading the way, talking a mile a minute. Stuffed after she eats, she'll sprawl on the couch and have a long nap, safe from the world.

I have two very simple recipes. The first is a simple salad with tomatoes, mozzarella cheese and basil. The entree is a very easy barbecued chicken. Thank you for asking. I am feeling just fine. I hope you are too! — Annie

TOMATO, MOZZARELLA AND BASIL SALAD

6 ripe medium-sized tomatoes 1 bunch fresh basil, washed and dried

1 pound fresh mozzarella, thinly sliced

2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil freshly ground black pepper and salt to taste Mix together the oil, vinegar, catsup, onion, mustard, Worcestershire sauce, garlic and pepper flakes. Rinse and pat dry the chicken breasts and place them in the marinade in a shallow, container for several hours or overnight. Refrigerate or freeze. To serve let the chicken and marinade defrost, if frozen, and either cook the breasts outdoor on a grill or on a stovetop, basting and turning. If there is leftover marinade, bring it to a boil and serve it with the chicken. Serves 6.

The Key to Poker is Extracting Value

You might think the goal of a poker hand is to win it. While that's certainly true, it's not that simple.

In a \$1-\$2 no-limit hold'em cash game, anyone can look down at pocket aces, move all in and swipe the \$3 pot when everyone folds, but who wants to win a small pot? The real goal of poker is to win while also extracting the most value you can from a hand.

That's easier said than done, and knowing when to go for value and

how much is an art in itself. Many players struggle with it, myself included, and sometimes certain spots will leave you shaking your head. I recently played two hands that show knowing when and how to go for value isn't as easy as knowing when to hold 'em and when to fold 'em.

The first hand took place in a big \$5-\$10 no-limit cash game when I looked down at 4c 4h and was one of three players to put in \$30 preflop. The 4d 4s 9h flop gave me four of a kind, which was the stone-cold nuts.

Moving all in here was out of the question. I was sitting with around \$1,000, and such a big bet would surely scare off my opponents. Even if one of them had a nine or even a bigger pocket pair, they would simply fold and wait for a better spot.

Instead, I checked, and an opponent bet \$75. The third player folded, and I just called before checking again on the 9c turn. I checked once more, and my opponent bet \$175. I decided to check-raise to \$375, hoping my opponent had a nine, which seemed likely when he called.

On the Qd river, I opted to move all in for my last \$450 or so, assuming my opponent had either a nine or big pocket pair and would call. What I didn't realize was that he had complete air and had called my check-raise with the intention of bluffing the river. By moving all in, I took away that option, and he could only fold, meaning I lost out on the value.

In hindsight, I should have checked, as he would have either bluffed or moved all in if he did have a nine. I won the hand, but I made a mistake by betting.

In a smaller 0.50 in no-limit home game, I was in the big blind with Js 3h when action limped around to me, which meant I got to see the Jc Jh 6d flop for free.

Everyone checked, and the 6s paired the board on the turn, giving me a full house. I checked again, hoping another player would bet, but that didn't happen before the 9s completed the board on the river.

I checked for a third time, expecting someone who paired the nine to bet. Instead it checked around, and one player showed 6c 8h for a worse full house. I couldn't believe he didn't bet. Had I bet for value, he undoubtedly would have called.

Like I said, knowing when and how to go for value is an art — one that I have yet to master.

Avoid These Mistakes to Improve Your Game

Do you want to improve your blackjack game? You can by avoiding these common mistakes made by blackjack players.

Playing 6-5 Games

Unfortunately, many casinos offer blackjack games where a player blackjack pays only 6-5 (instead of the traditional 3-2). This is a horrible game for players even when it's offered on a singledeck game. Stay away from any blackjack game that doesn't pay 3-2 for a blackjack. (If you are unsure what a blackjack pays, before you sit down and buy-in ask the dealer. If they say "6-5," tell them adios.)

Playing with a Continuous

your bankroll. Don't play on tables that have them!

Using a Progressive Betting System

If I've said this once, I've said it a hundred times-progressive betting systems will not change your odds of winning one iota. Some of them are dangerous; others will have you betting more than you normally would and, therefore, your theoretical loss will increase. Whether or not your previous hand just won (or lost) has no bearing on whether your next hand will win (or lose). The only variable that affects your chances of winning in blackjack is the ratio of high cards to low cards in the un-played deck(s) of cards. Therefore, the only time it makes mathematical sense to increase your bets is when the un-played cards contains more high cards than low cards. Therefore, you should be watching the cards on the layout on each round. If you don't see many picture cards or aces in the early rounds that would be a good time to increase your bets (or better yet, learn a simple card counting system like Speed Count).

Making Side Bets

Players can make numerous side bets while they play blackjack. Match Pair, Lucky Ladies, you name it, you'll probably see it on the table the next time you play. All of these side best have one thing in common: the house edge is high. Sure, it only costs a buck to make one of these side bets, but those dollars you bet on every hand keep adding up, and unless you are very lucky, at the end of the day you'll wind up a loser. Stay away from side bets!

Taking Your Bad Luck Out on Others

If you start losing, don't take it out on the dealer or the player at third base. How they play their hands has no long-term effect on your chances of winning or losing (that's a fact). So, stop the blame game and instead focus on how to play your hand correctly (and start watching the cards on the layout).



Shuffling Machine (CSM)

A CSM is an automatic shuffling device used by many casinos. It's different from the traditional automatic shufflers that have been in use for many years. With a CSM, the dealer takes the discards from each round (or several rounds) and puts them back into the CSM where they are randomly mixed with the rest of the cards (usually a CSM holds 4-5 decks). Every round with a CSM is like playing a round from a freshly shuffled deck of cards. Because there is no pause in the action for a dealer hand-shuffle, the casino can deal roughly 20% more hands per hour with a CSM. This increases a player's exposure to the house edge and the average player's theoretical hourly loss will correspondingly increase. Therefore, CSMs will put a hurt on

Not Using Basic Strategy

Playing by hunches is the biggest mistake I see players make at blackjack. In this day and age, the correct basic playing strategy for blackjack is readily available in books and on the Internet. Why, you can even take a strategy card with you when you play. You'll face a 1% or higher house edge if you play by hunches and only a half a percent house edge if you play by the basic strategy. Enough said.

Drinking Too Much

Have you even seen a drunken player winning at blackjack? In thirty years of playing, I've seen just the opposite-players who drink too much when they play (after all the drinks are free) managing to lose all their money. You need a clear head when you play blackjack because you have to use your brain to make playing decisions. Moreover, drinking too many alcoholic beverages (just because they are free to players) will cloud your thinking process. Play first, drink later...that's the best advice I can give you.




