#### LENT/EASTER

This year, 2018, Easter Sunday will be April 1. This means that the 40 day season of preparation which we call Lent will begin on Wednesday, February 14. That day, "Ash Wednesday" is traditionally observed as a fast day and received its name from the custom of marking a worshiper's forehead with ashes to signify repentance. (There are actually 46 days between February 14 and April 1, but the 6 Sundays are not counted because they are feast, not fast, days.)

As in years past, we have several special opportunities for worship and study during this time:

**February 14 8-9am**, our sanctuary will be open for individual meditation and prayer. **Wednesdays, February 21 - March 21, 10am-12pm**,

a study sponsored by the Women of Hebron Lutheran Church.

## Green Team News On January 16<sup>th</sup> the session approved a proposal from the Green Team that Madison Presbyterian Church submit an application to become certified as an Earth Care Congregation (ECC). In 1990 the PC(USA) adopted the resolution: "Restoring Creation for Ecology and Justice" which invited congregations to participate in this certification program, based on the "Earth Care Pledge" to participate in actions in the four areas of worship, education, facilities, and outreach. Currently there are three other congregations in The Presbytery of the James with ECC certification: St. Andrews in Kilmarnock, Westminster in Charlottesville, and Colonial Heights Presbyterian. The honor includes a certificate, use of the ECC logo, listing on the PC(USA) Environmental Ministries website, notification of our presbytery, a press release for local publicity and an earth care book for our church library. The Green Team prepared for this proposal by completing an audit form showing the particular ways in which our church already qualifies for the certification. Examples include everything from recycling some of our waste and having roadside cleanups, to having a Breakfast Buzz on the topic of agriculture in Madison County, to saving energy by having double-glazed windows. If certified, we will then have the opportunity to apply for recertification every year, through continuing to encourage our church to participate in Earth Care in new ways. As the newsletter is "going to press" we are waiting to hear whether our application has been approved. More news next month! **Berta Storey Green Team Leader**

# Madison Presbyterian Church Mission Team 2017 Distribution

The Madison Presbyterian Mission Team is pleased to announce the 2017 end of year mission distribution. We would like to express our deep gratitude for your contributions and ideas. We are excited to support the following organizations and causes:

Boys and Girls Club of Madison County

Contribution: \$500

Purpose: Provides a safe place and engaging activities to help children achieve their fullest potential. The Madison Boys and Girls Club is an important venue for children's after school activities.
