

Range Use

Events scheduled with the BOD have first priority for range use. In the case of club league matches (i.e. military match, rimfire silhouette, black powder rifle, etc), every effort shall be made to leave 4 vacant shooting positions open for the use of club members who are not participating in the league event. General members are free to use the range during normal operating hours when no events are scheduled. Firing positions and parking spaces are on a first-come-first-served basis.

Range Operating Hours

Range hours are divided into seasonal schedules of Summer and Winter Hours.

SUMMER HOURS begin on the first Monday in April and continue until **WINTER HOURS** begin.

SUMMER HOURS

Sunday 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday: 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

WINTER HOURS begin on the first Monday in November and continue until **SUMMER HOURS** begin.

WINTER HOURS

Sunday 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday: 12:00 p.m. (noon) - 4:00 p.m.

The range may only be used if a RSO is present. If anyone is observed using the range without an RSO present, it should be reported to the CRSO or the BOD. The range may be closed by the RSO during severe inclement weather. If the temperature is 32 degrees Fahrenheit or below, the range may or may not be open.

Permitted Firearms

Any legally owned and legal to own firearm is allowed to be used on the range provided that the firearm is in safe operating condition. This necessarily means that some shooters will require more proficiency and experience than others. This is particularly true with fully automatic weapons fire. Fully automatic firearms will be controlled at all times. No one under the age of fifteen is allowed to operate fully automatic weapons. In other regards any rimfire pistols, centerfire pistols, rimfire rifles, centerfire rifles, muzzle loading rifles, muzzle loading pistols and shotguns may be used. Handguns carried in a holster or other holding device are exempt from the range rules as long as the handgun is not being fired and stays in the holster. This means that a "carry pistol" does not have to be unloaded and placed on the bench before making the range safe. Shooters may not unholster the carry firearm while the range is safe.
