

Carlo Acutis: The First Millennial Saint by Nicola Gori



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Jesus is the reason for our hope. Death could not defeat him. When he rose from the dead, he brought with him a light and a life that will never go out. He shares that life with us. At baptism, a candle is lit and we're invite to receive the light of Christ. We can't defeat death on our own.

Jesus shares his light with us and we are asked to share our light with others. In our second reading, we are told we should always be willing to give an explanation for our hope. We need to study and learn about Jesus. How do we do this? When the Bible speaks about knowing, as we heard in the Gospel, it is knowing with our head, our heart and our body. We know Jesus because we are in a relationship with him, we are connected to him. We spend time in prayer with him, being with Jesus in church, and especially by being able to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

Who are the people we can share our faith with? In the first reading, Phillip explained his hope and faith in Jesus to the Samaritans. These are people who worshiped God in a different way. They did not come to the temple. Through Phillip, they saw the power of God and received the Good News of Jesus with great joy.



Living our Faith: Use your actions to explain your hope in Jesus to those around you.


