These are some of the toughest, most spirited people I know. I think there is value in hearing from our Pantry clients firsthand. ### Comments from Pantry clients:

"We really appreciate the Pantry here in Franklin, Ohio. About a year ago I lost my good job. I have found some part time jobs but they don't provide enough money to buy groceries for my family."

"If it wasn't for this place my family would go hungry.

We live paycheck to paycheck and some months it's just not enough to buy groceries we need."

"This establishment has been very kind to me, helping me with food and furniture. I'd like to be able to be the one helping others out but I just can't right now."

"So I'm here today at The Pantry and it's been about 3 years since I've needed help. I figure right now I need a little help and it's great to know they are here when I need it. They give you really nice stuff!"

"A lot of times I'd go hungry if it wasn't for this place."

"My husband lost his job 5 years ago and if it wasn't for The Pantry we would starve to death."

"This place is a blessing from God. They help people on a set income, that can't afford to buy groceries or to pay a bill, to help feed their children."

"I am homeless, I am 60 years old and I have absolutely nothing."

"These pantries are absolutely necessary to fill whatever gaps we might have."

"We can walk to this pantry and that helps a lot because we don't have a car. We really depend on this place, I mean we need it a lot."

"This place has been a great help to me. I am a senior on social security and I don't make a lot. Sometimes it's hard to feed myself."

"Lots of months I only have enough to pay my light bill and rent so The Pantry really helps supplement my food source."

The respect, kindness and professional atmosphere was overwhelming, I had tears in my eyes. The staff of this facility treated me as a human being and I was not looked down on just because I needed a little help. My husband and I both have worked hard our entire lives. After my husband spent 22 years of his life serving our country in the United States Marine Corps, there were job losses so now we struggle financially.
