Financial report – 5 months ending May 30, 2018. 1stCindy, 2ndJohn, Approved. Pool expense came over projection due to opening and repairs. Delinquent accounts tabled for closed meeting discussion. Replacement Reserves figures general fund at budget expectation and Vinyl Siding Fund could be doing better but still have through Sept. Bill: Point made to discuss adjusting budget numbers to reflect changes for the concrete and asphalt. Judy requested this be moved to closed meeting for further questions and understanding of changes. Bill agreed and all approved.

Management Report - Stacy Klabak, Clearview Property Management Services

1A. OneUnit(62401-4 Raleigh Ct.) listedforsale\$109,000Ex.

2A.Foreclosure unit (82-1) has been readied for listing. Unit is a basic (Bill) with unfinished basement but will have all new flooring and appliances. Bill and Cindy to schedule a walk through for review and price discussion before listing. Jim Reuschlein to accompany.

Paint scheduled reviewed and approved - Vinyl installation schedule reviewed and approved (1st by Judy, 2nd Phil) for 9 buildings for 2018 (56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64.) Work to begin Sept and continue through Nov. Posted in clubhouse for members.

Concrete work begun for the season and bid/pricing was provided to board as attachment for a total cost of \$14,889. Spring inspections were completed and scope of work to choose for the year is in process.

Third year of geese program. Three active nests for 16 eggs. Member inquiry (75-1, Louann Lansn) as to what more can be done to deter them since the "poop" is disgusting. Bill explained highlights of the program and extent of our active participation. Stacy also noted the extent of the requirements. Phil noted the improvements already being seen. JR is working on the communication with local apartment community that is also dealing with issue. Hopes to coordinate efforts.

#4 listing of all contracts in place. Extra billing for April - \$4,036.90

Open issues: Lewis Brothers Landscaping discussion on repairs from winter damage, moving of cars and system for being mindful to have your vehicles out of the way (but not too early that people park in areas that also need clearing for neighbors) and how we might be able to get volunteers to assist or be subject to fines. Salt or material will be replaced to avoid the sticky material seen this last year. Switching is expected to increase the cost. Tick - Tock - Tick

Warm summer days beckon us to enjoy the sights, smells and sounds of the great outdoors. In addition to protecting against mosquito bites, the Oakland County Health Division reminds us to protect ourselves against ticks as we spend more time outside. Lyme disease is an illness caused by a bacterial infection transmitted by a tick bite. According to Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), there were more than 300 reported human cases of Lyme disease in Michigan in 2017.

"Residents are urged to protect themselves against Lyme disease and other tickborne diseases by avoiding tick bites." said Leigh-Anne Stafford, health officer for the Oakland County Health Division. "If you find a tick attached to your body, quickly remove it, watch for symptoms, and contact a medical provider if you experience symptoms."

Symptoms include fever, rash, muscle and joint pain, dizziness, and/or a bulls-eye rash. Treatment in the early stages of Lyme disease usually leads to complete recovery.

Ticks travel on their hosts and can be found in many places outdoors, including parks and backyards. Using precaution in areas most likely to be infested with ticks, such as wooded or grassy areas (especially where deer and other wildlife are present), is the best way to avoid potential infection.

Reduce your risk by:

- Wearing long-sleeved shirts; light-colored, long pants; and closed-toed shoes.
- Tucking shirts into pants and pants into socks.
- Applying insect repellent containing DEET (20% 30%) or Picaridin to exposed skin and to clothing.
- Applying permethrin to clothes and shoes (do not apply permethrin to skin).
- Avoiding contact with overgrown grass, brush and leaf litter.

Protecting your pets as well, as they can come into contact with ticks and carry them into your home.

Check your entire body for ticks immediately after leaving outdoor areas likely to have ticks, and take a hot shower as soon as possible. If you discover a tick attached to your skin:

- Grasp the tick with tweezers as close to the skin as possible.
- Pull gently but firmly, but do not squeeze the body of the tick.
- Try to pull the tick out without leaving mouth parts embedded in the skin.
- After removing the tick, wash hands and bite area thoroughly with soap and running water. Apply an antibacterial cream to the site of the bite.

Michigan citizens can submit ticks to MDHHS for identification and possible Lyme disease testing, free of charge. Residents can also send electronic photos of ticks to the MDHHS for identification to MDHHS-Bugs@michigan.gov. For more information on how to submit your tick and/or photos, visit Michigan.gov/lyme.



Try this one pot summer veggie pasta for a great summer dish!

- 1 box corkscrew pasta
- 3 cups cold water
- 1 cup diced onion
- 2 zucchinis, sliced
- 2 yellow squash, sliced
- 1-pint grape tomatoes
- 1 cup fresh basil
- ½ teaspoon salt

1 cup marinara sauce

- Add olive oil and onions to a 12 inch skillet and cook over medium high heat until softened.
- Add the box of pasta, zucchini, yellow squash, tomatoes, and basil to the skillet.
- Pour 3 cups of cold water and salt into the pan ensuring that the water covers the pasta (it does not have to cover the vegetables).
- Turn the heat up to high and cook for 10 minutes, stirring regularly, until the water is absorbed.
- With about 1 minute left add the sauce then remove the skillet from heat and top with cheese. Serve immediately.
